DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Facing west, the Post Office is located in Brookhaven, Mississippi (population 10,700), at the SE corner of Cherokee Street and Jackson. The building is on a level site and has foundation plantings of clipped shrubs and border plants. Combining the Beaux Arts style with certain Italian Renaissance and Mission elements, the Post Office is the most imposing public structure in Brookhaven. The one-story brick building on a raised, stone basement has a low hipped roof with pan tiles and deep bracketed eaves. Segmental arches supported by wide brick piers create the building's arcade on Cherokee Street. Similarly arched casement windows complete the fenestration on the Jackson Street elevation along with doorways at opposite ends of that facade. The exterior details of the building include decorative brickwork in the spandrels and frieze, a narrow terra cotta string course, a dentilated architrave and cornice, and wall lanterns. The interior of the building remains relatively unaltered and has its original mahagony writing tables and red, green, and white terrazzo floor with a marble border. The Post Office retains its architectural integrity to a high degree.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

AND A CONTROL OF THE CON

The Brookhaven Post Office is being nominated under Criteria C.

Built in 1912, the Post Office is a unique building in Brookhaven. No other structure in the town embodies the characteristics of the Beaux Arts, Italian Renaissance, and Mission styles. Constructed by the Treasury Department, the Post Office was designed by James Knox Taylor (chief architect) and Louis A. Simon (supervising architect). Because very few post offices were built in Mississippi during this period, the designs attributed to James Knox Taylor are very rare in the state. The building is located across the street from Whiteworth College, Mississippi's first women's and third oldest college, which together with the Post Office forms the town's most architecturally significant group of institutional buildings.
