Describe present and historic physical appearance.

The Heath Springs Depot is located parallel to the railroad tracks near the the commercial strip of the small community of Heath Springs in rural Lancaster County. The depot was constructed by the Southern Railway in 1903. It is typical of small frame depots constructed in the early twentieth century by railroads in South Carolina.

#### Additional Information

The Heath Springs Depot is a one-story frame building on brick pier foundation, covered with shiplap siding and a continuous molding at the window sill height. The crimped metal hipped roof has slightly flared eaves, with a deep overhang supported by simple stylized brackets and knee braces. Vertical boards divide the facades at the junctures where the brackets and the soffits and walls meet. The track or west facade has a square bay window flanked by a double window and a double door with transom-lights and a cargo door with a chamfered frame with beaded board panels. The two-bay east facade has two single doors with transom-lights. The east facade has a double window and a single window in the passenger area and a cargo door in the rear. The south facade has a single cargo door.

The Heath Springs Depot, built in 1903, is significant both as an intact example of early twentieth-century depots built in South Carolina, and for its association with the transportation of freight and passengers on the Southern Railway in the period 1903-c. 1940. It was the third depot built at Heath Springs, which developed in the 1880s after railroad service was introduced to that section of Lancaster County. Its primary use was in the transportation of cotton, cottonseed and cotton oil products from nearby farms and cotton oil mills, textiles from nearby textile mills, and granite from the nearby quarry.
