DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Karcher-Sahr House, built in 1911, is a two story Neo-Classical house that has an attractive corner location. The landscaped grounds are accentuated by a polychrome cut stone wall that almost surrounds the house; this material, left from the moraine of the glacier, also serves as the dwelling's foundation. The basic floor plan is rectangular and two rooms deep while the roof is a medium pitched gable with wood shingles.

Actually, the house is only half of a design. Therefore, it is asymmetrical and the main entry appears at the left portion of the front facade rather than the center. The entry is the building's most impressive feature with six fluted Ionic columns grouped in threes and supporting a pediment. To balance this, there is a small pedimental dormer on the right side of the front facade. Beneath the eaves of the entire structure, there appear modillions.

Another portion of the entrance is a screened-in balcony that has a spindle balustrade as does the main porch. One unusual feature is a bay door that has leaded and beveled glass sidelights. Two other openings on the front facade warrant mention. They are: a small spherical window with four key stones located at the center of the typanum; and a palladial surround over three flat topped windows.

Because the house is a half of a design, each side is different. The north or right facade has many windows of varying sizes and shapes that appear irregularly on the walls' clapboard surface. The south facade has a bay window and a two story screened porch with six Ionic columns. The rear facade has slightly projecting bay windows and a screened-in rear entry. All the screened-in portions were original with the home.

The building's original exterior design by Glen L. Saxton of Minneapolis has not been noticeably altered. The owners had W.A. Jenkinson of Sioux City, Iowas, redesign portions of the interior in 1938. The home at that time was the first in Pierre to have wall to wall carpeting. One of the most striking rooms is the dining room with a cross timbered ceiling and beautiful engaged furniture.

#### STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Karcher-Sahr House is one of Pierre's best examples of Neo-Classic architecture which became the vogue during early twentieth century in the United States. The residence is in fact one of the better homes of this type in the state. It is important that each state have its best architecture given the proper credit of being a work of art.

The original owner, Henry Karcher, was one of Pierre's pioneers who traveled to the area for a hunting trip. The future for the town seemed bright so he purchased a lot and built the first brick commercial building that is still standing today. Karcher was a prominent citizen serving as both alderman and mayor; his career in politics may have gone further but he suffered a paralytic stroke in 1907.

Prior to this, his main interest had been in ranching but the stroke prevented him from this profession. So Karcher moved into the city and built this dwelling in 1911 and looked after his large land holdings. Henry Karcher died in 1924.

Mrs. Adeline Karcher, his wife, was also a prominent citizen of Pierre being instrumental in the founding of the Women's Club, the Carnegie Library, and Riverside Cemetery. Her daughter Marguerite married Fred Sahr, and they became the next owners. She was active in the Women's Suffrage Movement as a writer for feminist newspaper called the MESSENGER.

William K. Sahr, their son and present owner, is a prominent attorney in the state capital and has served as a state legislator and was president of the library board which was responsible for the erection of the Rawlins Municipal Library.

So the home has remained in ownership by one family, who have shown a deep regard for the dwelling by maintaining its integrity. Because of the house's outstanding architecture, it should be placed on the National Register.
