Description:

The Samuel Robertson House is a two-story brick, Italianate style residence constructed in 1872. The house was built in a side passage plan and is rectangular in form with a prominent two-story bay on the west facade. On the main (north) facade is an original recessed entrance with original double doors of wood and glass. The door surround has decorative wooden pilasters and a sheet metal cornice with large brackets. Windows on the main facade are arched one-over-one sash with gabled sheet metal hood molding. Other windows on the house are also one-over-one sash but lack the decorative moldings. On the east facade is a small one-story frame porch added ca. 1920. On the west facade is a large two-story bay extension. The roof is hipped with pressed metal shingles and interior chimneys. The interior was inaccessible. At the rear of the house is a ca. 1970 frame garage.

Statement of Significance:

The Samuel Robertson House is a notable example of a late 19th century Italianate style residence. The house was built in 1872 with the original owner unknown. The house was purchased in 1879 by Samuel Robertson a leading merchant and banker of Elizabehtown. The Robertson family occupied the house during the late 19th and early 20th centuries. The house is a notable example of the Italianate style and has not been significantly altered. Its entrance and hood molding on the main facade are fine features of this style and it retains its original character.
