### **Description**

Located on State Highway 274 at the point where it crosses an unnamed ditch (approximately 1/4 mile from its junction with state Highway 203), the State Highway 274 Bridge is of the timber trestle type. It consists of a total of seven spans, the longest of which is 15 feet. Its total length is 105 feet, its deck width is 28.4 feet and its overall width is 31 feet. Its abutments and piers are constructed of wood and its deck material is wood timber covered with asphalt. A simple wood rail balustrade runs the full length of each edge of the deck.

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#### **Significance**

Constructed in 1940, the State Highway 274 Bridge is associated with the *World War II Era* historic context and is of the timber wooden trestle type. Though the identity of its original designer does not survive, it was constructed in conjunction with the Arkansas State Highway Commission and thus may well have been designed by one of that state agency's engineers. Given its relatively intact condition it retains sufficient integrity to remain associated with its historic period and is thus locally eligible under Criterion C.


