Summary

The Wesley Chapel is a single-story, wood frame church building designed in a restrained version of the Greek Revival style. Its strictly rectangular plan features a pair of western or front entrances and another on the southern elevation placed toward the eastern end. A single brick flue (now removed) rose through the center of the ridge. Its asphalt shingle gable roof and weatherboarded walls rest upon pyramidal concrete block piers.

Elaboration

The Wesley Chapel is a single-story, wood frame church building designed in a restrained version of the Greek Revival style. Its strictly rectangular plan features a pair of western or front entrances and another on the southern elevation placed toward the eastern end. A single brick flue (now removed) rose through the center of the ridge. Its asphalt shingle gable roof and weatherboarded walls rest upon pyramidal concrete block piers.

The western or front elevation is punctuated with a pair of single-leaf doors, symmetrically placed. A pair of gable returns provide the only other detail. The eastern elevation opposite is fenestrated with a pair of six-over-one wood windows (originally six-over-six, the lower sashes were broken by vandals; they are scheduled to be replaced) placed directly opposite the doors, and also features gable returns. The northern elevation is fenestrated with four regularly-placed windows; the southern elevation is similar, the only exception being the substitution of a single-leaf entrance for the second window from the east.

The interior of the building is entirely finished in wood. The plank wooden floors, and the board-and-batten walls and ceiling are original, as is the rostrum at the eastern end of the sanctuary. Most of the heavy wooden pews are also original.

The changes to the Wesley Chapel are few and all relatively minor. The original wood shingle roof was replaced with asphalt shingles in 1952 and the wooden steps were replaced with concrete steps in 1953; it was probably at this time also that the original wood blocks upon which the building rested were replaced with the present concrete blocks.

The Wesley Chapel is in very good condition.

Summary

Criterion C, local significance

The Wesley Chapel is locally significant by virtue of its being the last known example of a late nineteenth century building of any type in this area that reflects the residual effect of the Greek Revival style.

Elaboration

The small, rural community of Woodlawn (located approximately twelve miles south of Pine Bluff in northern Cleveland County) is the site of the Wesley Chapel United Methodist Church (commonly known simply as the Wesley Chapel), the congregation of which was first established in 1870. Apparently Woodlawn has always been relatively rural, as Goodspeeds' Biographical and Historical Memoirs of Southern Arkansas, published in 1890, does not record Woodlawn as one of the established post offices within the county, though it does mention nearby Randall.

The land for the construction of the Wesley Chapel was donated to the church trustees by Augustus R. B. Bridges and his wife, Margaret C. Bridges. The church was on the Lehi Circuit of the Pine Bluff district, Little Rock Conference of the United Methodist Church.

This frame building was constructed by men of the community in 1872; no architect was known to be involved. However, the identity of some of the builders is known: John Jackson Norton, W. D. Jackson, James Black, Allen Dorman, John H. Dixon, Henry Allred, and members of several other local families.

The Wesley Chapel served the local Methodist community throughout the late nineteenth century and well into the twentieth, supporting an active congregation through the 1960's. Since then the congregation has dwindled, and now the building is in the hands of a group of interested local residents who have not only maintained the building but have sensitively refurbished the building, inside and out, within the past two years.

The Wesley Chapel remains one of the few known intact historic structures in this vicinity. Though it is likely that other buildings and structures of this era survive, most have probably been sufficiently altered or modified over time to render them unrecognizable as such. However, the most noteworthy quality of the building -- aside from its preservation -- is its minimal yet identifiable Greek Revival detailing. The low overall proportions so common to Greek Revival buildings are complemented by the projecting pediment eaves and the gable end returns with friezeboards that ornament the eastern and western elevations. It is well known that the Greek Revival style remained popular throughout Arkansas for approximately a decade after the Civil War, to which several surviving examples around the state attest; however, this is the only example of this phenomenon in the Woodlawn area. It stands as a reminder both of the architectural landscape of the state in the first few years after the Civil War and of the small congregations that proliferated in town and country alike.






