The Eureka Schoolhouse is a small one room building of hewn timber construction with wooden board siding cut in such a way as to simulate cut stone blocks. The building was dismantled and stored for many years and was restored at its present location in 1968. Since completion of the schoolhouse one of the earliest covered bridges in Springfield, Vermont, has been moved to the site and work is under way to establish the surrounding area as an historic roadside park between Vermont Rt. 11 and the Black River outside of Springfield, Vermont.

The Schoolhouse has been restored using all of its original material which was carefully marked before it was dismantled. The interior of the Schoolhouse was furnished with desks, maps, books and other schoolroom equipment of the 19th century. Two of the school desks and many of the books were original to this schoolhouse.
