Describe the present and original (if known) physical appearance The southern boundary of the Eighth Street Park Historic District is West Sixth Street. The western boundary is North Broom Street from West Sixth Street to West Ninth Street. The eastern boundary is North Franklin Street from West Sixth Street to West Tenth street, the northernmost point in the district. The easternmost point in the district is the 1200 block of West Eighth Street between North Harrison Street and North Franklin Street. West Eighth Street between North Broom Street and North Franklin Street forms part of the north boundary.

The focus of this district is the Eighth Street Park, which is bordered by North Broom Street to the west, North Franklin Stree to the east, West Eighth Street to the north, and West Seventh Street to the south. The park slopes downward to the east. At the eastern end of the park is a playground equipped with modern equipment: swings, a jungle gym, and a sliding board. At the center of the park is a small, one-story brick pavilion, built in the 1940's as a public rest room. It has a medium-pitched, hip-gabled roof. Curved concrete walkways connect the pavilion to the sidewalk along the edge of the park. Many trees in the park date from the early part of the century.

The southern boundary of the district is the 1300 block of West Sixth Street. The north side of the street was developed between 1890 and 1900, while most of the south side was built up between 1900 and 1920. The houses on the north side are similar in style to the houses on West Seventh Street, built in a simplified Second Empire style. The south side of the block has a wider variation of styles similar to the Second Empire style. 1336-1346 West Sixth Street is a two-and-one-half story row house with a battlement cornice. There is a square projecting bay on the second floor and a porch with ionic columns.

The 1300 block of West Seventh Street, facing the south border of the park, was developed between 1890 and 1900. 1300 West Seventh Street is a two-andone-half story, Queen Anne house with an 'L' shaped gable roof. 1302 to 1326 West Seventh Street are three-story, semidetached houses in a vernacular Second Empire style. 1328-1332 West Seventh Street are three-story row houses with a large three-window bay on the top two stories. 1334 West Seventh Street is a two-and-one-half story rowhouse with a low mansard roof and a three-window bay on the second story.

The western boundary of the district is formed by both sides of North Broom Street from the 600 block to the 800 block. The east side of the 600 block was built between 1890 and 1900 in the Queen Anne style. The houses are three-story, semi-detached buildings with the third story window inside a steep-pitched cross gable crowned with a conical roof. The corner house, 624 North Broom Street, has a round turret with a conical roof on the left side of the facade. The west side of the block was built between 1910 and 1920 in a vernacular Second Empire style. 601-615 North Broom Street

Statement of Significance (in one paragraph)

The Eighth Street Park District contains significant examples of domestic architecture showing two periods of settlement into western areas of the City: first, by wealthy manufacturers and later, because of improved transportation, by the new middle class which was spawned by the industrial revolution. This area also is associated with urban reform movements of the early post-Civil War period.

This district is being nominated because it is associated with events that have made significant contributions to the broad patterns of local history (criteria A), it is associated with the lives of persons significant in our past (criteria B), and it embodies distinctive characteristics of a period of construction (criteria C).

The focus of this district is the Eighth Street Park. This plot of land, which was owned by the City, was set aside as a park on July 2, 1865, by referendum for use as a public park. It was the first and only City park until 1886.

The first house to appear in the district is the James Tilton house, Bellevue, which was built in 1802. Tilton served as the Director of Military Hospitals during the Revolutionary War, the President of the Medical Society between 1789 and 1822, and the Surgeon General for the U. S. Government between 1813 and 1815. He strongly supported having the American capital located in this area which he named Federal Hill. The Eighth Street Park was renamed in his honor in 1970.

The next tenant for the house was Charles Howland, a manufacturer of sewing machines. He bought the house in 1852 and put on a new facade and added a tower in 1856, changing it from a Georgian mansion into a Gothic-styled, Italian villa. This house is now used by the University and Whist Club.

The next house built in the district was 1219 West Eighth Street, located diagonally across from the northeast corner of the park. It first appears in the 1868 <u>Pomeroy and Beers Atlas of Delaware</u>. It was owned by B. F. Miller, a local manufacturer of stoves. It is an excellent example of an early urban villa in the Italianate style. There was an out building, probably a carriage house, located on the site of what is now 800 North Franklin Street.

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are two-and-one-half stories with a small false mansard roof and a projecting bay. 617-619 North Broom Street are similar, but with a medium-pitched, mansard roof with dormers.

The 700 block of North Broom Street, facing the west side of the park, was built between 1910 and 1920. 703 North Broom Street, the sole survivor of three mansions built on this block, is built in the Georgian Revival style. It has a mansard roof with three dormers. 709-711 Broom Street is a Georgian-style apartment house built in 1938 and 1939.

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The 800 block of Broom Street is north of the park. The district includes 800 to 806 Broom Street on the east side of the block, which was built in the shingle style between 1890 and 1900. The Greek Orthodox Church, which is next to the houses, was built in 1948 on the site of a du Pont mansion long after development of this neighborhood, and therefore, is not located in the district. On the west side of the block, the district includes 803 and 805 Broom Street. 803 was built between 1890 and 1900 and is a three-story, Queen Anne styled house. It has a mansard roof and ionic pilasters. The porch has ionic columns. 805 Broom Street is the University and Whist Club, which was altered to its present Gothic Italian villa style in 1856.

The eastern boundary of the district is formed by the 600, 700, 800, and 900 blocks of North Franklin Street. The west side of the 600 block was developed between 1890 and 1900. Like 1314-1326 West Seventh Street, it is a three-story, semi-detached house built in the Second Empire style. It has a mansard roof with a single paired window dormer with each unit. The east side of the block is more varied in its period of development. The earliest house, 618, was built between 1880 and 1890 in the Italianate style. 1213 West Sixth Street and 600-606 Franklin Street are two-and-one-half story row houses with a shallow-pitched, gable roof between. They were built between 1890 and 1900. 620-624 Franklin Street, which were also built during this period, are in the Second Empire style.

Most of the houses on the 700 block of North Franklin Street were built between 1880 and 1890, except for 708-710 which was built in the late 1860s and was used as the first Wilmington Hospital. 700 and 706 Franklin Street are two three-story houses built in high style Second Empire. Both houses have a bell curve mansard roof with tin shingles and a tower on either side of the facade. 714 and 718 Franklin Street are simpler variations of the style, having a medium-pitched, mansard roof with large gable dormers. 716-718 Franklin Street has had a new roof added on and is not considered eligible.

The 800 block of Franklin Street has houses of different styles and time periods. The earliest house on this block is 801-803, which is a two-story, Italianate, semi-detached house located on the same block as

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similar houses of the same period located on the 1300 block of Eighth Street. Houses on this block were built in variations of Second Empire style and a style similar to shingle style. 804-806 Franklin Street are two variations of the Second Empire style, joined by a party wall. 804 Franklin Street, which was built between 1880 and 1890, is a three-story house with a mansard roof with exposed rafters and wall dormers. 806, built between 1890 and 1900, has a mansard roof and a tower pavilion offset towards the party wall. The Second Baptist Church, located on the southeast corner of Ninth Street and Franklin Street, was built in the Gothic style in 1910. The church has basically an octogonal plan with cross gables facing both Ninth Street and Franklin Street. It has a green-tiled, tent roof with a steeple in the center.

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The 900 block of Franklin Street was mainly developed between 1900 and 1910, and it contains many unique homes. Houses were built in either the Queen Anne, Second Empire, or other styles. 900 is a castle style, Queen Anne house with a hip-gable roof and a round turret with a battlement cornice. The porch is enclosed and has square door posts. 904-914 Franklin Street are in the Second Empire style. 916-920 Franklin Street is a triple unit, two-and-one-half story, Queen Anne house. It has a steep-pitched, hip-gabled roof, with three square towers for each unit. The porch has turned wooden posts and gingerbread trim. 905 is a two-and-one-half-story house in the shingle style. It has a cross gable roof and terra cotta trim. 911 Franklin Street is a three-story, brick, Romanesque house with a hip-gabled roof with a cross gable forming an "L" shape and a round brick turret. It has brownstone trim and stained glass on the upper sash of the first story window.

The end of the 900 block of Franklin Street is the northern most point of the district. Eighth Street forms the northern boundary between Franklin and Broom Streets. Since the boundary also includes the end of the 800 block of North Broom Street, the northern boundary is a "U" shape.

The 1200 block of West Eighth Street forms the eastern most portion of the district. The south side of the street was built between 1880 and 1890. 1200-1204 is a two-story, Italianate triple. 1206-1212 are built in the Second Empire style, and 1214-1216 is a Italianate, semi-detached house with a corbelled brick, dentil cornice. The windows are rounded on top and have brick arches. There is a three-window bay on the first story.

On the north side of the block, 1209-1215, two three-story, brick, semi-detached houses, are built in the Second Empire style. Both houses have a mansard roof and projecting bays on the second story with a tower roof towards the center of the facade. 1219, built before 1868, is a three-story, Italianate country villa. The round top windows are paired and have decorative arches over each unit.

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The 1300 block of West Eighth Street, the earliest block facing the park, was developed between 1876 and 1880. The houses are three-story, semi-detached, Italianate designs, which had been modified in the late 19th and early 20th centuries. 1317 to 1319 have elaborate Victorian gingerbread trim on the porch; 1319 has an added second-story, three-window bay; 1329 has a projecting second-story enclosed porch. Two of the houses, 1309-1311 and 1313-1315, which were built between 1890 and 1900, are in the Second Empire style. There are three stories, the third story being a mansard roof, and have a tower on each side of the facade.

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Survey Methodology

An architectural survey of Wilmington's West Side, in the summer of 1982 resulted in the identification of the buildings comprising the Eighth Street Park Historic District as potentially eligible for the National Register. This survey is part of an on-going city-wide survey of all the structures built before World War II. Architectural surveyors from the City's Planning Office prepared a structure form, locus form and photograph for each building. Copies of this information enter a state-wide cataloging system and are available in Wilmington at the City Office of Planning and in Dover at the State Bureau of Archeology and Historic Preservation.

Boundary Justification

The boundaries of the Eighth Street Park Historic District were determined by the age of the buildings within the district and the pattern of development in the area. The buildings within the district boundaries illustrate the themes discussed in the statement of significance. Buildings adjacent to the district, particularly to the east, are potentially eligible for the National Register, but development in this area responded to different influences than those involved in the Eighth Street District.

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Tilton, Holland, and Miller were examples of the early residents of the area, the very well-to-do who could afford to live on what was then the outskirts of the city.

The next building appears to have been 708-710 North Franklin Street, located across the street from the east boundary of the park. It was purchased in 1871 by the City Council to be used as the first public hospital in Wilmington, which treated victims of industrial accidents. However, reports of featherbedding, and mismanagement by Council-appointed administrators, forced the hospital to close in 1879.

Both the park and the hospital were early manifestations of the reform movement aimed at improving the quality of life in Wilmington. In both cases, the goals of the promoters were not realized until the latter part of the century. The referendum that set aside the park also defeated an effort to purchase land along the Brandywine River to be used as a park. The City-run hospital was a defeat for the physicians who wanted the hospital administered by doctors rather than politicians. Both the park movement and the hospital movement were products of the wealthy upper middle-class industrialist, who lived in the City and decided they had a stake in improving it.

Between 1876 and 1880, about a half-dozen, semidetached, Italianate houses were built, mostly along the 1300 block of West Eighth Street, across from the north side of the park. Unlike Miller and Howland, these residents were not wealthy, but of the comfortable middle class; 60 percent were clerical workers, and the rest were owners of stores and small industries.

Between 1880 and 1890, new construction centered along Franklin Street, between Seventh and Ninth Street and on Eighth Street, east of Franklin Street. Most of the examples of this priod were built in the Second Empire style, of which 700-706 Franklin Street and 1209-1215 Eighth Street are prime examples. Other houses were built in the Italianate style, such as 1214-1216 Eighth Street.

The opening of the Eighth Street trolley line on December 14, 1889, spurred the growth of the neighborhood. It was one of the first electric trolley lines in the City, and the first in this section of the City. The Sixth Street line was added in May of 1901.

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Most of the houses in the district were built between 1890 and 1900. A variety of styles were used, inculding Queen Anne (600-624 and 803 Broom Street and 916-920 Franklin Street are significant examples); Second Empire, shingle-style (800-806 Broom Street), and 900 Franklin Street, which is a Queen Anne with a castly-styled turret; and a Romanesque house (911 Franklin Street).

The chapel of the Second Baptist Church on Franklin Street was dedicated on March 13, 1892, and the main part of the church was built in 1910. The congregation, which had been previously located at the corner of Fourth and French Streets, was known for their missionary work among the poor of the city. At the time of the move, their pastor was Reverend Richard Cook, author of many books on religious topics and Baptist history, notably, <u>The Early and Later Delaware Baptists</u>. He resigned from the pulpit in 1893. This church is now used by the Mother African First Methodist Church.

The west side of the 600 and 700 blocks of Broom Street and the south side of the 1300 block of Sixth Street were mostly built between 1910 and 1920. Most of the houses continued to be built in the Second Empire style or a variation of it. There are a couple of

notable exceptions: 1336-1346 Sixth Street, which has a battle ment cornice; 703 Broom Street, which was built in the Georgian Revival style and is the sole survivor of three mansions that were built on that block. 709-711 Broom Street is a Georgian Revival apartment house built in 1938 and 1939.

The people who settled in this neighborhood during its 40 years of development were middle class; industrialists, shopkeepers, white collar workers, skilled workers, and managers. In 1900, industrialists formed the largest single group of residents and included Thomas Savey, vice-president of Pusey and Jones; Charles Eisenmenger, president of Bavarian Brewing Company (1317 West Eighth Street): William Phillips of the Phillips-Thompson Company (811 North Franklin Street); and a number of small-scale industrialists and businessmen. Manufacturers of all the major industries of Wilmington were represented; breweries, chemicals, electric power, and morocco leather. Unlike many cities, Wilmington's industrialists were not from out of town and didn not live in the suburbs outside the city. However, this neighborhood was not an exclusive enclave of industrialists, but a neighborhood of people of all levels of the middle class. For example, Oscar Govert, a teller NPS Form 10-900-a (7-81)

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at the First National Bank, lived a couple of houses away from Esinmenger, who lived several houses down from David Ranok, a machinist at 1307 Eighth Street. This street housed members of the boards of directors of many local firms. However, most of the major industrialists were located north of Eighth Street, and south of that street was predominantly white collar and sklled workers. The individually commissioned homes were located north of Eighth Street. This boundary had broken down by 1910 after most of the industrialists had either died, retired, or moved away.

The architecture of the houses in this neighborhood represents a good cross-section of the styles of the period: Italianate, Second Empire, Shingle Style and Queen Anne. The most common style in the neighborhood is the Second Empire style. The oldest house of this style, 1309-1311 West Eighth Street, was built between 1876 and 1880. The high style Second Empire houses were built betwe r 1880 and 1900, most of them before 1890. Examples of high style Second Empire houses include: 700-706, 821-827 North Franklin Street, 1210-1212, 1209-1215, 1309-1315 West Eighth Street. A vernacular Second Empire continued to be popular long after the high style had died out. Houses of this style were built between 1890 and 1920. Examples of this style include 601-619 North Broom Street, 608-616 North Franklin Street, 1300-1334, 1311-1333 West Sixth Street, and 1300-1326 West Seventh Street.

Only one of the Italianate houses in the district could be called high style Italianate: 1219 West Eighth Street which was built between 1860 and 1868. Since the style was well-suited for the urban setting, a vernacular Italianate continued to be used up to the turn of the century. A majority of the houses were built between 1876 and 1890. Examples include 618-620, 708-710, 802, 801-803 North Franklin Street, 1200-1204, 1214-1216, 1301-1307, 1317-1331 West Eighth Street.

The Queen Anne style is not too common in Wilmington. Although the style had begun to decline on the national scene by 1880, all of the houses in the district of this style were built between 1890 and 1900, as were similar houses in the Baynard Boulevard area. Examples include: 803 North Broom Street, 900, 916-920 North Franklin Street and 1300 West Seventh Street.

The Shingle style which was so popular in the 1890's is also represented in the district. Unlike the rural style, the houses here use slate NPS Form 10-900-a (7-81)

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shingles and the first floor is made of brick. The examples in this district were mostly built between 1890 and 1900 and include 800-806 North Broom Street, 800 and 903 North Franklin Street.

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This neighborhood represents the growth of Wilmington's new middle class arising from the industrial growth from 1830 to 1880, into the western areas of the city that were being developed inthe late 19th century. This neighborhood also shows examples of the different styles of this period; Italianate, Second Empire, Shingle style, and Queen Anne.
