Describe the present and original (if known) physical appearance

The Crookston Carnegie Library is an essentially rectangular structure with a shallow rear projection and front entry. The single-story library is constructed of buff-colored pressed brick set upon a high raised basement of dressed stone.

The Neo-Classic style building has a centrally located entry contained within a pedimented portico with four Ionic columns. The tympanum of the pediment is decorated with a round window in a garland surround. The roof line is marked with carved stone ornamentation. The parapet roof has a modest cornice with dart-and-egg molding, a motif carried over in the column capitals. A central dome has been removed.

Windows in the raised basement are large and square. On the main floor, rectangular windows with stained glass transoms are separated by raised brick pilasters. A stone belt course encircles the building above the window lintels. A doubledoor front entry is centered between narrow rectangular windows. Large stained glass windows are located above the outer and inner doors of a front vestibule. Interior rooms are divided by their original dark oak Ionic columns.

Statement of Significance (in one paragraph)

Charles Ross, builder

The Crookston Carnegie Public Library is significant for the role it has played in the intellectual and cultural growth of the city, for its architectural contribution, and for the use of plans by Bert Keck, a Crookston architect. It is a well preserved example of the 65 libraries in Minnesota financed by Andrew Carnegie. The Crookston library had its origin in a reading room established in 1879. In 1882 a circulating library was established. The first library was located in a school and, in 1902, moved to rooms in the Odd Fellows Hall. The library board sought a permanent site and appealed to Andrew Carnegie for funds in 1903. He offered a \$12,500 contribution, but little happened until 1907. That year a grant of \$17,500 was made on the condition that the city provide a site and \$1750 per year for library maintenance. Crookston architect Bert D. Keck designed the library, a rare incidence of local design of a Carnegie library in the state. The building was formally dedicated in 1908 and was used until 1983 when a new library was built nearby. The Neo-Classic style structure remains on its site, an important contribution to Crookston's architectural heritage.
