### GROVETON CONFEDERATE CEMETERY

IN THIS ENCLOSURE LIE 866 CONFEDERATE SOLDIERS.  
ALL OF THEM CASUALTIES IN THE SOUTHERN VICTORY  
HERE AT SECOND MANASSAS, AUGUST 29TH-30TH, 1862.

AFTER THE WAR, THESE MEN WERE MOVED FROM THEIR  
HASTY GRAVES THROUGH THE EFFORTS OF LOCAL  
WOMEN TO PROVIDE A PROPER RESTING PLACE.

UNFORTUNATELY, MOST OF THE DEAD ARE UNKNOWN.

BATTLE OF SECOND MANASSAS  
THE DOGAN HOUSE

On August 29 and 30 1862, this log and frame house, the residence of Henry Dogan, was the center of heavy fighting in the Second Battle of Manassas (Bull Run). The high ground along the sky line to the northwest was held by Stonewall Jackson's corps of the Confederate Army. Occupying an unfinished railway embankment there, the Confederates repulsed repeated Union attacks made across the sloping ground in front of this house. The heaviest attack, launched by Porter's corps on August 30, left this ground strewn with Union dead and wounded.

**NATIONAL ZOUAVES**

MUSTERED INTO THE U.S. SERVICE APRIL 27<sup>TH</sup> 1861.  
REORGANIZED AS A BATTALION APRIL 27<sup>TH</sup> 1863.  
DISTINGUISHED BY 23 BATTLES AND CAMPAIGNS INCLUDING THE  
BATTLES OF THE CONFEDERATE ARMY AT APPROXIMATELY 14,000  
MEN AUGUST 30<sup>TH</sup> 1862 THE REGIMENT ASSISTED IN  
REPEATING THE ASSAULT OF A SUPERIOR FORCE OF THE  
ENEMY LOSING NEARLY A THIRD OF ITS NUMBER ONE OFFICER  
AND THIRTY MEN WERE KILLED OR MORTALLY WOUNDED  
"BRAVER MEN THAN THOSE WHO FUGHT AND FELL THAT  
MAY SOON NOT BE FOUND"

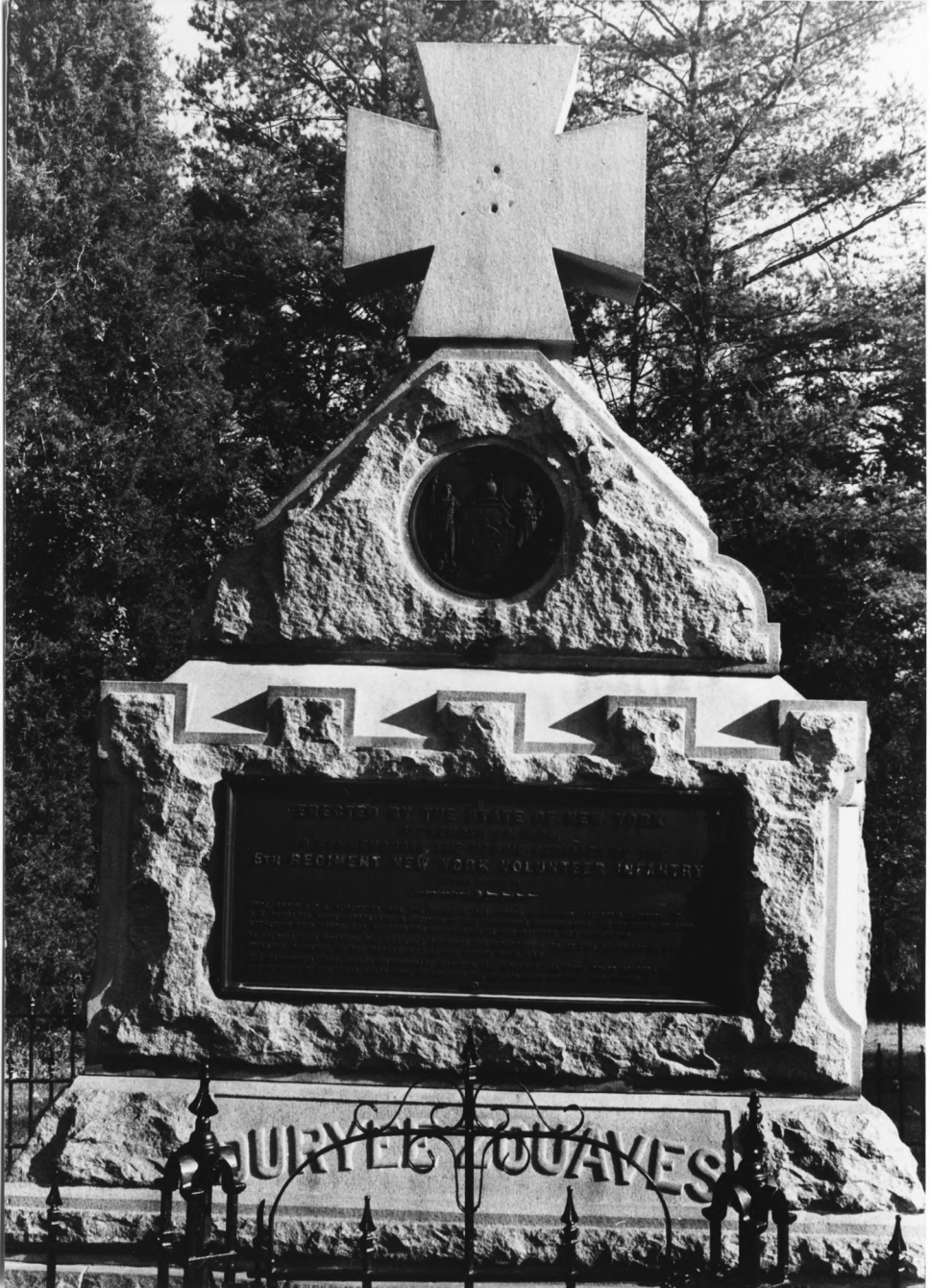
