Description Vaughn's Stage Coach Stop is a two-story, weatherboarded frame, gable-roofed residence with a double-pile and central-hall floor plan. Stylistic elements and composition would support the local traditon of a ca. 1820 construction date. The building has end chimneys, rear shed rooms, and a left rear addition. The facade (southeast elevation) features a one-story, shed-roofed porch supported by six slender wooden posts. A plain wooden balustrade has been removed. The symmetrical facade displays five nine-oversix windows on the second story aligned above a central double-leaf entrance with multipaned transom and sidelights, flanked on each side by two nine-over-nine windows. The first floor interior features a central hall with flanking rooms. and a stairway with a landing on the right. Marbelizing accents the first floor baseboards, mantels, and stair risers.

<u>Significance</u> Little documented history is available about Vaughn's Stage Coach Stop. An 1873 map of Fairfield County indicates that it was located in a rural community know as Simpson's Turnout.¹ <u>A Fairfield Sketchbook</u> states that this location was on an old stage road between Columbia and Winnsboro.² The building is important as an early-nineteenthcentury vernacular residence in Fairfield County.
