The Pearson Brick House, located on Wahoo Valley Road, Kingsport vicinity, Sullivan County, Tennessee, was listed in the National Register of Historic Places on April 11, 1973. This two-story, brick residence was built circa 1860 and was listed under Criterion C for its architectural significance. The house was demolished November 29, 2014. As a result, the Pearson Brick House has lost the significance for which it was listed and no longer retains integrity of location, setting, design, feeling, workmanship, or association. Therefore, the Pearson Brick House should be removed from the National Register.

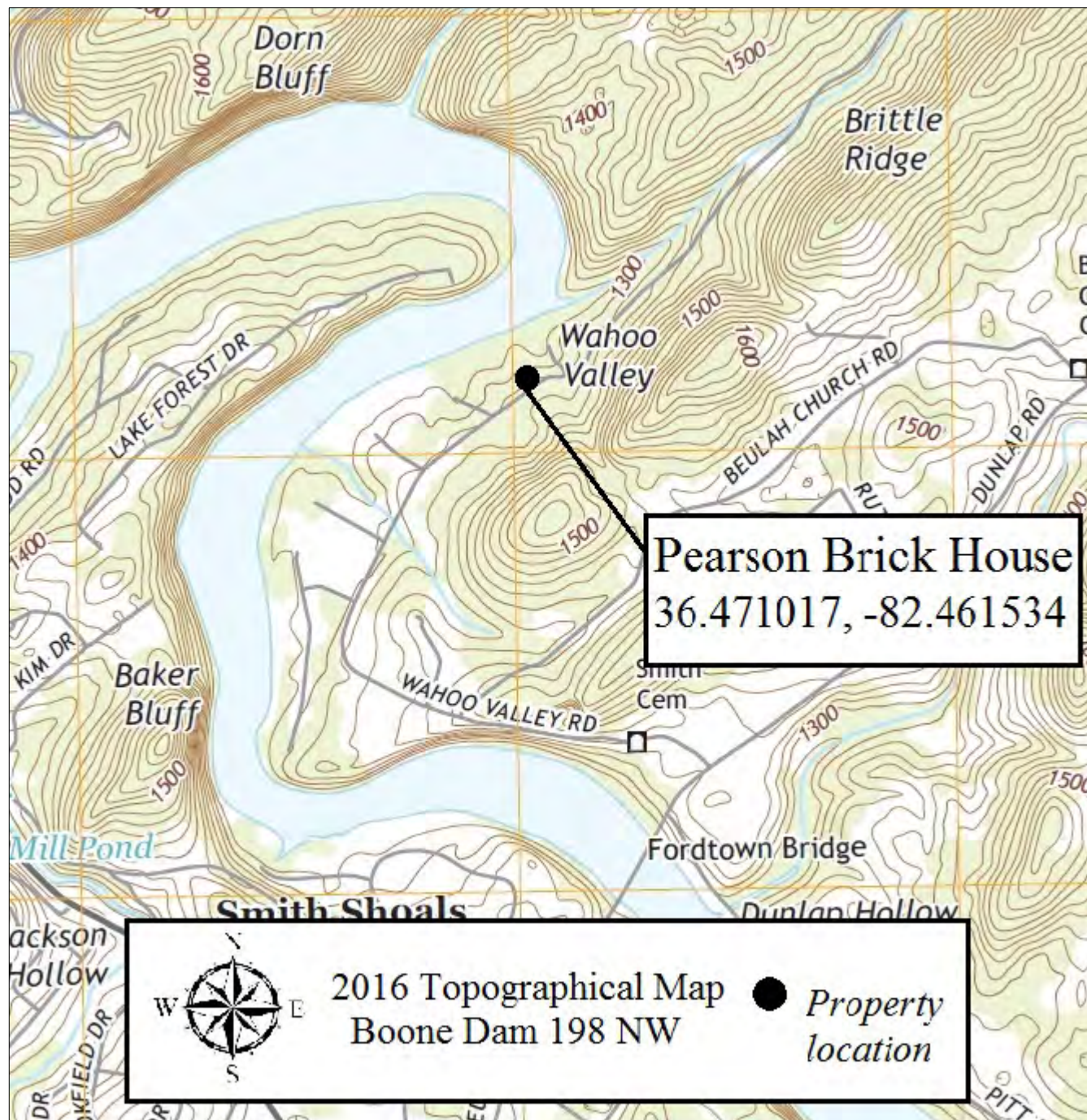

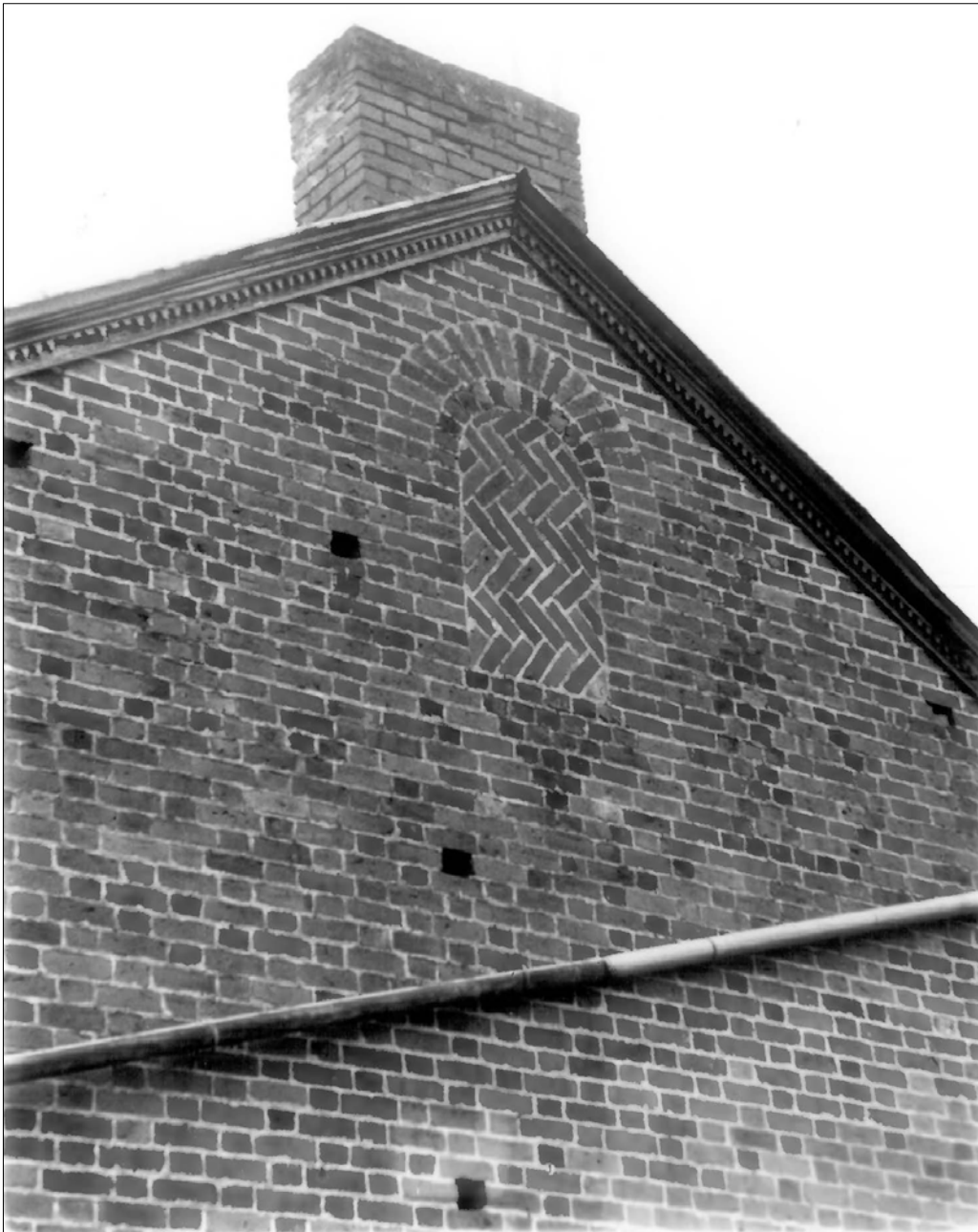

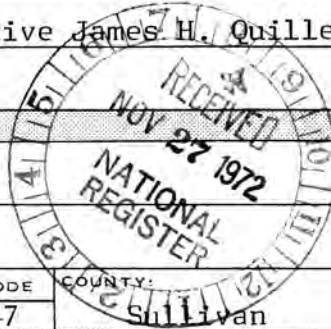

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The ornamental brick house is perched on a hill overlooking the South Fork of the Holston River. Shipley Ferry Road runs directly behind it. The house is a simple two-story rectangular structure with recent additions of a one-story front porch and a kitchen with attached back porch.

Several architectural features are unusual for the area: the interior chimneys on each end; the refined cornice with punched detail; and the missing bricks which were used probably for supporting scaffolding when the house was built.

The ornamental brickwork makes the house unique in East Tennessee and is a detail rarely found throughout the state. On the eave of each side and worked in a herringbone pattern, is a design suggesting an arched window. Flanking this are the initials: "E B" on one side of the house and probably "I L" on the other.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Little is known about the house, which, with its ornamental brickwork, is unique in East Tennessee. The Barnes family owned the property through much of the nineteenth and twentieth centuries. Members of the family claim the house was built at the time of the Civil War, but this can be disputed on the basis of architectural style. It is difficult to date a house such as this in an area like East Tennessee. If found further to the eastern coast, it could be late eighteenth century, a conceivable but improbable date for its Tennessee location.

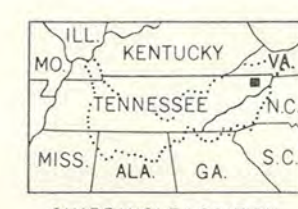

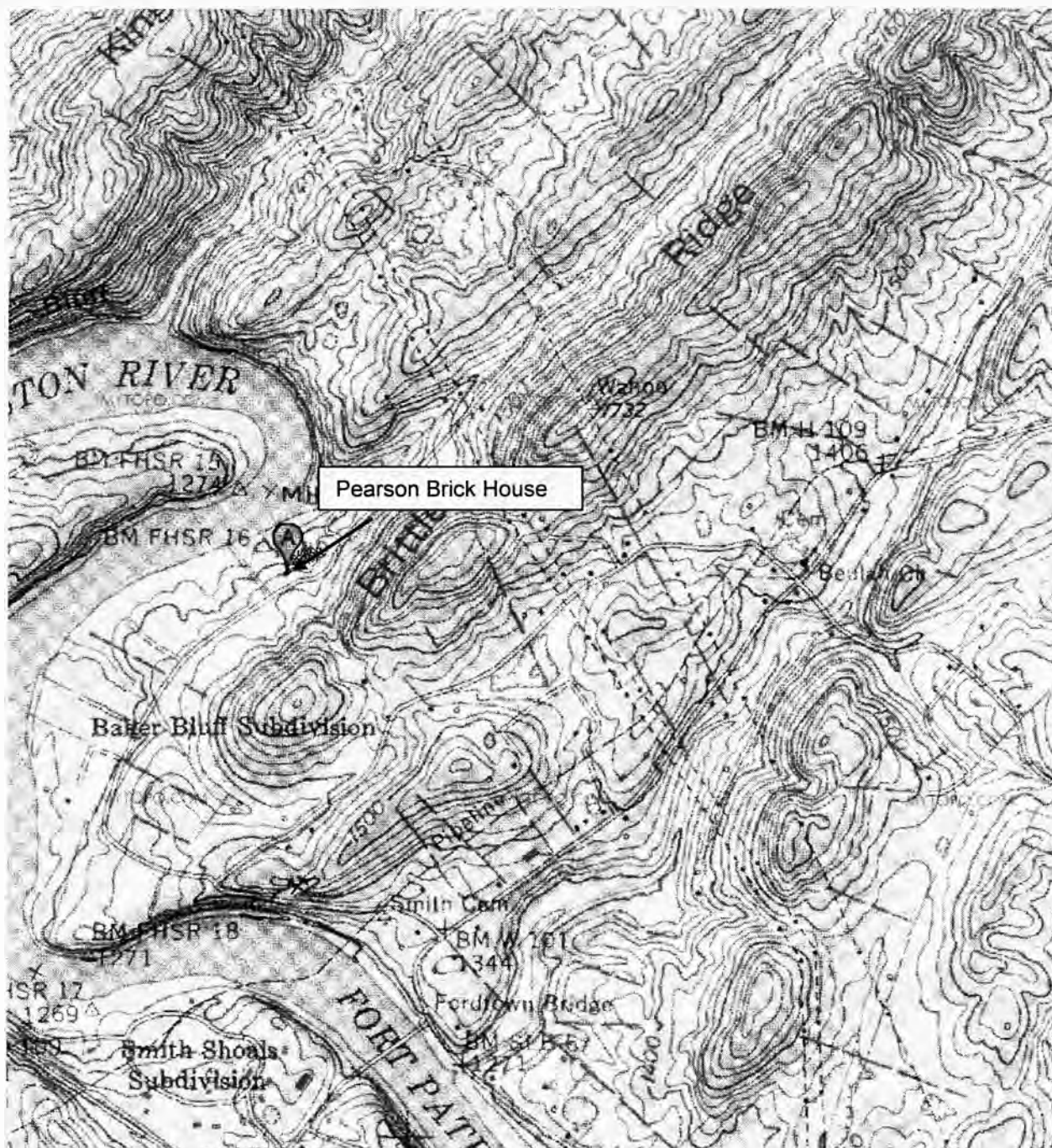

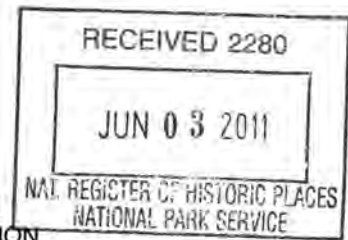
