

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Summary

Constructed c. 1933, the Hillyard Cabin is a single-pen vacation cabin constructed of horizontal sawn beams. The structure is covered by a gable roof and features a large stone chimney. A simple mantelpiece is the only interior detail. Located on Old Burr Road in the Warm Springs vicinity, the Hillyard Cabin is in the process of restoration.

Elaboration

The Hillyard Cabin was constructed c. 1933 as a vacation cabin by the property owner's brother. The single pen is fourteen feet square and is constructed out of 4" X 9" sawn beams laid horizontally and covered with battens. Interestingly, the beams are not notched at the corners, but are laid on top of each other in a chinkless fashion with alternate butt ends that are nailed. From a distance, the appearance is that of a cabin constructed of carefully hewn logs with half-notching. The cabin is covered by a composition-shingle, side-gable roof and rests upon wood joists and stone piers on the eastern elevation to compensate for the slope of the hill.

The front, or eastern, elevation consists of a full-facade front porch that is raised on concrete (soon to be supplanted by stone) piers and supported by three 2" X 6" boards. This porch, which is formed by a shed-roof extension of the main gable roof, has recently been completely reconstructed following the original porch plan. A rail wraps around the northern and eastern elevations of the porch and is also formed by 2" X 6" boards. Access to the porch is from the southern side, and it appears that the porch may be screened as there is framing for a door way on this elevation. Underneath, a single-leaf door is positioned to the right and a large, single-hung, one-over-one window to the left. The multiple-panelled wood door features an upper light and a mail-drop door.

A large, single-hung, one-over-one window placed just to the right of center provides illumination from the northern elevation. The rear, or western, elevation contains a single-leaf doorway at the southern end. The original door had deteriorated beyond repair and is currently in the process of being replaced. A massive limestone chimney dominates the center of the southern elevation, which is not otherwise fenestrated.

The interior is nondescript with the exception of the fireplace, which contains a simple wood surround with mantel and lining bricks that are stamped with their kiln of origin, "Laclede, St. Louis." This spartan interior is underscored by a floor that is no longer present. Due to deterioration, the flooring had to be removed and will be replaced in kind, as will some of the

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now-exposed joists which had also rotted.

Located on Old Burr Road to the northeast of Warm Springs, the Hillyard Cabin contains no ancillary structures or site features. The cabin remains on its original site, which originally featured a small, seasonal stream in front of, or to the east, of the porch. This stream no longer flows due to the construction of a pond upstream.

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Summary

The Hillyard Cabin is being nominated under Criterion C with local significance for its unique method of horizontal, sawn wood-beam construction.

Elaboration

According to *The Goodspeed Historical and Biographical Memoirs of Northeastern Arkansas*, in 1889 Warm Springs contained "noted springs", a post office, a two general stores, one drug store, two cotton gins, and a church/school building. Despite the presence of "noted springs," the town never capitalized on this industry to the extent of other Arkansas towns and remained a small community.

Nothing is known about the history of the nominated property prior to its acquisition by Mr. Hillyard in the late 1920's. Mr. Hillyard placed about 1000 goats on the land to clear the underbrush, and the farm was soon dubbed the "Goat Ranch" by the local residents. According to Mr. Youel Baker, a resident of the area at that time, the Hillyard Cabin was constructed between 1932 and 1933 for Mr. Hillyard's brother, a doctor from Illinois. Dr. Hillyard used the diminutive structure as a vacation home.

The Hillyard Cabin does not reflect any discernible architectural style, but rather the recreational tastes of the Depression era when people sought escape to "rustic" settings. The use of natural materials in the construction also suggests the Rustic style although this cabin bears little resemblance to the CCC-constructed cabins in Arkansas that many associate with the term.

In January 1976, the property was acquired by the Lord's Ranch, a care facility for problem youth. The Lord's Ranch recently initiated a restoration of the Hillyard Cabin, and a new roof and porch has been constructed by some of the young men working under supervision.

Because the Hillyard Cabin is the best known example in Randolph County - perhaps even the state of Arkansas - of its unique method of horizontal, sawn wood beam construction, it is being nominated under Criterion C with local significance.




