6. Briefly describe the present physical appearance of the site or structure and describe any major alterations from its original condition:

The LaGrange Odd Fellows Hall is a tall two story wood structure executed in a vernacular Greek Revival style popular in California during the 1850's. The standard classical motifs enhancing the facade are the modified roof pitch recalling the equilateral proportions of a Greek pediment, box cornice returns, tall narrow pilasters bracketing the building and the the three bay division with central doorway. The trim appears to have been painted green originally, contrasting with the white clapboard siding. Adapted from a New England tradition, this color scheme was one often employed in mid-nineteenth century California. The rubble stone foundation is also typical for the period.

The porch appears to have been added.
