
This house is significant under Criterion C as the best interpretation of the Queen Anne style in Louisa and probably the entire county.

[ C ] 14. History: Local tradition says that Levi M. Atkins built this house probably around 1890. He lived on this property earlier than this but probably in a different house. Mr. Atkins was successful in the timber and stave business and had sawmills on the Levisa Fork.

In an 1850 deed for this property, there is reference to the Grantors, Dr. Zattie Cushing and his wife, residing on the property. The Atkins-Carter House is rumored to have a log structure at its core which could be the earlier residence but it has not been possible to investigate the fabric for confirmation.

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

44. Site Plan (and boundary description and justification for N.R. sites):

#### **Boundary Description:**



Beginning at the intersection of the southerly line of Madison Street with the westerly line of Water Street; thence with Madison Street in a westerly direction to the property line of Dee Moore; thence with the property line of Dee Moore in a southerly direction 90 feet to a point, said point being corner to property J. E. Carter, Jr.; thence with J. E. Carter, Jr., property line in an easterly direction to the westerly line of Water Street; thence with Water Street in a northerly direction a distance of 90 feet, more or less, to the point of beginning. All of the land associated with the house is included in these boundaries.

#### 45. Description and House Plan:

This exuberant Queen Anne style house combines weatherboard and half-cove wood shingles to sheath this multi-gabled structure. The configuration of the house is T-shaped with a hexagonal tower at the west interior angle of the wings and a large one-story porch wrapping around the south elevation. The extension of the short second story into the tall gables characterizes the house as a cottage. The highlight is on the front facade where the gingerbread of a small balcony delicately enframes a bank of three tall and narrow windows on the second level. Below the balcony, there is a shallow rectangular bay sheathed in flush diagonal boards and capped with a bracketed bell-cast pent roof. The balcony is topped with a bell-cast hipped roof and each of the gable apexes contains ornamental bracing.

The roof of the main structure is pressed metal while the turret, rectangular bay, and balcony roofs and upper portions of the gable facades are covered with half-cove shingles. The wrap-around porch was remodelled at some point. Although it probably is true to the original in plan it lacks the delicate gingerbread that one envisions on the original. The new porch has brick columns and a brick wall and the face is unadorned. A small porch on the other side has been enclosed and a garage added.

Note: Second Floor - 4 bedrooms and bath, attic and basement.


