The Bacon design, whose entrance faces a corner, is Corinthian tetrastyle with a full entablature and pediment. The facade has brick quoins and round arched windows on the second floor with an emphasized keystone. All of the windows feature tiny panes of glass in the rectangular transoms. The clock tower rises in three stages culminating in a small dome with urn finial.

The elevated courtroom has a gallery that wraps around three sides with two sets of stairs leading up to it. Old theater seats are used on both levels. Beams divide the ceilings into nine recessed areas.
