ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION:

One-and-a-half-story gable-roof frame residence with pedimented tetrastyle portico on front (west) facade; smaller side (south) facade portico supported on seven-sided columns identical to those of front portico. Large entrance frontispiece with double-leaf doors framed by heavily moulded pilasters, side lights, transom, and tall moulded pilasters which support a pediment with dentils. Pilasters are found at all corners including a shed-roof section at the rear of which the ends project from the main body of the house. All doors and windows have the shouldered architrave trim; returns on side facade gables including shed-roof section. Center-hall plan which originally opened onto rear gallery (now enclosed) had rooms at each end.
