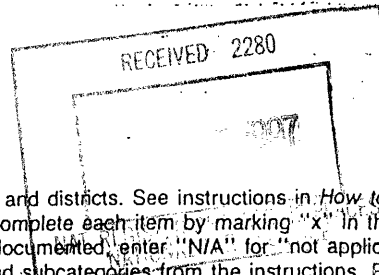

7. Description:

The J.S. Wallace House (BO-355) is located on the west side of the Lexington Road (S.R. 33, a.k.a. the Shakertown Road), on the northwest corner of the S.R. 1896 intersection. Sitting away from the main road, on top of a gentle rise, the residence is the only remaining historic building associated with the historic farm and is one of few examples of the Gothic Revival style exhibiting good historic integrity in the county. Although associated with a large amount of agricultural acreage, only the residence (contributing building) and fronting mid-nineteenth century rock fence (contributing structure) are included in this nomination. Additional associated acreage is excluded as it has lost its historical association through alterations in patterns and use.

1.) Facing the Shakertown Road, the c. 1850 **main residence** (contributing building) is a 1-1/2 story frame, center passage plan dwelling with board and batten siding and asphalt shingle clad cross gable roof. The residence portrays a Gothic Revival plan probably conceived from a pattern book in the late-nineteenth century. Gothic Revival influences include steeply pitched gables on each elevation with returned sawn bracket cornices in the gable ends, colored glass in windows and the front transom. Divided by three bays, the front (east) facade has a paneled central entry topped by a colored glass transom and fronted by a one-story porch with octagonal columns. The central gabled bay above the porch also features an entry, with a modern door in the original door facing. Original windows are paired, 4/4 sash with plain wood surround and trim, with some retaining the original colored glass in the upper panes. Each gable end features paired sash windows upper story. An offset ell extends from the rear (west) wall with a side entry on the north wall, with the same gable and entry as the front facade. A porch on the rear and ell has been enclosed with vertical siding. Additional features include paired and triple stack brick chimneys and a continuous stone foundation.

2.) Fronting the main residence, along S.R. 33 and S.R. 1896, is a **mid-nineteenth century dry-laid rock fence** (contributing structure). The fence parallels each of the roads and is separated from the residence by fields with paddocks divided by plank fencing.

8. Statement of Significance:

Located on the west side of the Lexington Road (S.R. 33), the J.S. Wallace House is architecturally significant on a local level under Criterion C, as a good example of Gothic Revival domestic architecture exhibiting decorative details typical of the style, including bracketed eaves, board and batten siding and elaborate or joined chimney stacks. Sitting on a moderate rise, away from and facing the main road, the residence is the only remaining building in Boyle County (outside of Danville) having all of these Gothic Revival characteristics. The fronting of the property's acreage by a mid-nineteenth century rock fence contributes to the setting of the Gothic Revival residence, indicating a prominent location on the intersection of two heavily traveled nineteenth century roads.

The property is nominated as part of the Multiple Property Listing: "Historic and Architectural Resources of Boyle County, Kentucky" under the theme "Domestic Architecture in Boyle County: 1780-1945." The period of significance for the property is c. 1850, the approximate date of construction. Constructed by local farmer, J.S. Wallace, the residence and rock fence are associated with a moderate agricultural farm. Due to changes in land patterns and use, the farm acreage is not included in the nomination. The residence maintains good historic integrity through its retention of original design, workmanship and details and is significant for its commanding setting along the intersection of the two roads; fronted by the rock fence.

10. Geographical Data

Verbal Boundary Description

The J.S. Wallace House (BO-355) is located on the west side of the Danville and Shakertown Road (S.R. 33), on the northwest corner of the road's intersection with S.R. 1896. The nominated property includes the main residence and rock fence, indicated by a dotted line within Parcel 6 on the accompanying Boyle County Property Identification Map 6. Located in the Boyle County Property Valuation Administration Office, the tax map has a scale of 1" = 600'.

Boundary Justification

The boundaries include only the main residence, the only resource historically associated with the J.S. Wallace property in the mid-nineteenth century, maintaining good historic integrity. The remaining acreage of Parcel 6 was excluded from the nomination due to loss of historic integrity through alterations in patterns and use.
