DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Pu'u o mahuka heiau (HASS-50-OA-F1-1) is situated on a high bluff 300 feet above the sea, overlooking Waimea Bay. About 570' x 170' in size, this is the largest heiau on O'ahu and is of the low-walled court platform typle temple.¹ Three adjoining enclosures form what seems to be the heiau proper with two smaller enclosures on the sea side lower on the bluff at the edge of the pali (cliff), one directly in front of the other. These two average about 25' by 35' with low surrounding stone walls. The lower enclosure of the heiau proper is small and is said by Thrum to be of more modern construction "to commemorate a kahuna's (priest's) successful wager with an alii (royal person), but it is no part of it (the heiau)." Together the two larger enclosures are 520 feet in length. The lower contains a maze of small, low stone walls; the upper enclosure contains smaller terraces and platforms. It is thought probable that the bodies of Captain George Vancouver's men were sacrificed at this heiau. They were killed by the natives in May 1792 when attempting to procure water for the Daedalus at the mouth of the Waimea River.

According to Stokes the upper terrace was once paved with large stone slabs which were reported in 1962 (Schumacher) to have been torn up and piled along the edge.

The heiau has not been restored and is relatively intact in a ruined condition. Most of the brush has been cleared from within and immediately around the heiau and the grounds are maintained as a small park. Schumacher reported minor repairs made in 1960. The small amount of vegetation growing within the walls is not so profuse to prevent grasping the features. A road, partly paved, leads to the park. A paved parking area lies adjacent to the heiau on the north side. The park is surrounded by privately owned ranch land but the appearance of the vegetation suggests that no cattle are grazing at the present time.

^{1.} A detailed description of the heiau is contained in McAllister) although this is based on investigations done in the early 1930's. Unfortunately, little substantial research has been done since and the general outlines are drawn from early studies. McAllister includes a ground plan of the heiau, a copy of which is included with this inventory. His description is still essentially correct, although repeated visits to the site indicate that rocks and rock features are frequently modified by unknown visitors acting on their own.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The appearance of Pu'u o mahuka heiau is physically and scenically impressive. It is the largest heiau on O'ahu and according to Schumacher "is probably the most important single heiau on the Hawaiian Islands and O'hau's greatest priests came from this district."

Verbal Boundary Descriction

The boundary of Pu'u o mahuka heiau is shown in red on the copy of the enclosed Tax Map Key entitled:

Enlarged section of Tax Map Key--Zone 5, Sec. 9, Plat 05 for O'ahu, current as of August 1978. Source: Tax Map Bureau, State of Hawaii. The boundary includes the current parcel 68 known as the Puu-o-mahuka Heiau Site of 4.00 acres and additional private lands encompassed by a line geginning at the west corner of the heiau site and running westerly along the north boundary of parcel 21 to the Waimea benchmark, thence returning east along the bed of Kalahopele Gulch for a distance of about 1800 feet; thence in a straight line, wouth-southwesterly to the north boundary of parcel 21; thence westerly to the point of origin.

Justification: The boundary encompasses the heiau itself and the small park area surrounding it. In addition it incorporates 2 small enclosures said to be related to the heiau proper. Additionally it incorporates the bluff itself on which the heiau is located.
