ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION:

Two-story asymmetrical composition with pedimented gables; front veranda with corner conical-roofed turret, and tower with conical roof. Textured wall surfaces include horizontal siding, fish-scale shingles, and a shingled side facade area between the first and second floors. Balustraded front porch has turned balusters with center beads; porch turret frieze enriched with turned spindles. Multiple panel double-leaf front door topped by stain-glass transom, flanking stain glass picture window with paneled apron.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE:

The Elson family was one of the earliest to settle in Meridian and evidently became prosperous enough to build a very outstanding house during the early period of Meridian history. L. C. and J. Elson are listed in the Meridian section of the 1879 Business Directory of Vicksburg as having a general merchandise store. L. C. Elson was a trustee of Meridian's first public school, which opened in 1885.
