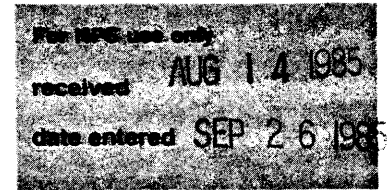

4. Owner: John Rudolph, 821 12th, Las Vegas, N.M.
7. Description: Coving at foundation; stucco over adobe walls; asphalt shingle roof; moderate overhang with exposed purlins; wood shingles on dormers and gables; 1/1 double-hung windows with wood surrounds, wood casement windows (dormers); two single doors in deep recesses; stout lathe-turned columns with two profiles of cut-out folk wooden brackets. Located in the western portion of the Sulzbacher and Rosenwald Addition, described earlier with Building #1559.
8. Significance: Begun before 1900, with a final addition about 1930, this is another interesting example of the New Mexico Vernacular tradition. The original house was a front facing L-shape adobe house with a front porch along the inside of the "L." About 1930, the crook of the "L" was filled in (including the left pair of windows in ill. 56). The wood shingled second story faintly resembles local Bungalow Style houses. The columns of the porch displaced by this addition were reused on the new side-facing porch. Whether the unique folk brackets date to the original construction or to the 1930 remodelling is not known.
