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#### Describe the present and original (if known) physical appearance

7. Description

Walking down Fifth Avenue in Lewistown, one sees the original, though faded, sign for the CULVER STUDIO painted on the side wall of the studio itself, built in 1899. This two-story brick structure has been altered slightly over the years by the removal of a second story balcony which hung over the Fifth Ave sidewalk and the closing in of the transom lights over the front doorway and two front, lower level windows. Otherwise the building retains its original shape and features.

The Culver Studio is rectangular in shape and rests upon a sandstone foundation. Interconnected wooden structures extend from the rear of the building and were used as living quarters. Original daylight printing hoods are set in the second story windows on the south and west corners. The glassed-in camera room extends from the north side of the building and catches the east light. An outdoor stairway is also original although the enclosed entry way was added later.

The windows are set below brick relieving arches with sandstone keystones and on sandstone sills. On the front facade, there are two fixed windows on the ground floor with covered transoms and two smaller fixed windows on the second floor with open transoms. The side windows are double hung one-over-one. There is a doorway with a transom on the south side and two doors on the front: the main entrance and one above which once opened to the original balcony. The roof is flat and there is decorative brick corbelling at the roof line on the front facade.

### Statement of Significance (in one paragraph)

The Culver Studio, a typical late 19th Century, two-story, brick commerical/residential structure built in downtown Lewistown, Montana, is significant in its association with William Culver. Culver was a noted photographer who, in addition to his commercial portraiture, captured many scenes and events of the early day central portion of the state. He photographed the Judith Roundup in 1884 and the opening of the English Sapphire mine (a difficult project in the pre-flash or floodlight era).

Before William Culver settled down to his professional career as a photographer, he carroused the west, hunting, trapping and trading with the Indians. Culver established his first studio in Maiden, Montana in 1883, but moved to Lewistown three years later. He built his brick studio and residence on Fifth Avenue in Lewistown in 1899. During the winter of 1899-1900, the upper story served as a classroom for Lewistown's first high school and the Culver family moved in in the spring. Culver also established a studio in Old Utica, then a leading cowtown. He spent a few days each month in the Utica area, travelling by buggy with a signboard on the back.


William Culver's interests ranged far beyond the camera and darkroom. He played the cornet and organized and directed the first Lewistown band. When Lewistown was organized as a city, he was elected to the city council and aided in the early planning and development of the city. He helped build the first opera house in Lewistown and managed it for many years. Culver lived in Lewistown for a total of 44 years.


The Culver Studio remains a repository for several collections of historic photographs which form a pictorial record of the growth and development of central Montana. Culver himself photographed and catalogued 138 early pioneer residences during his career.
