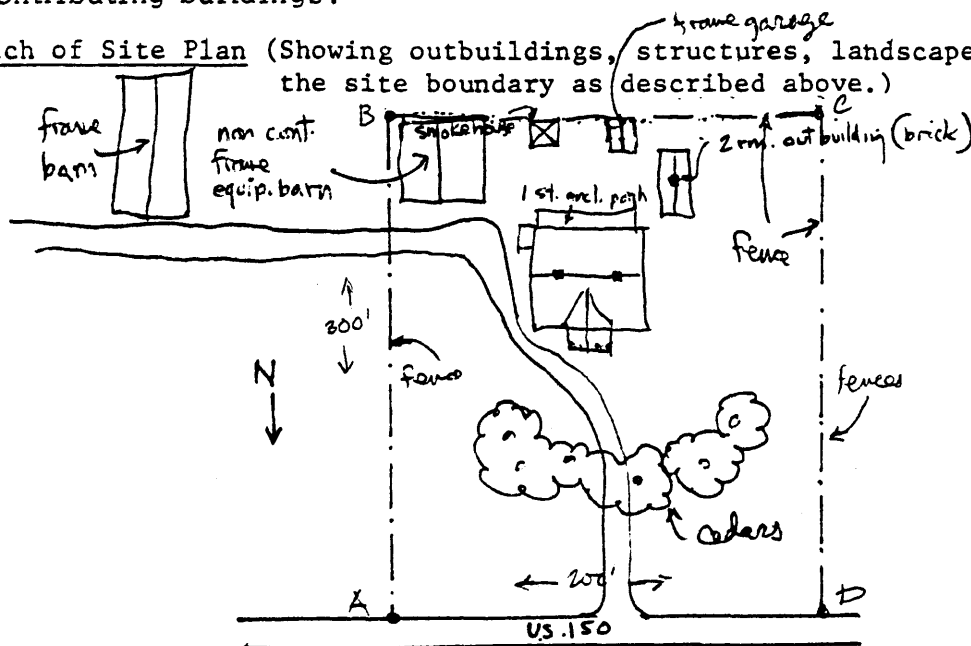

Verbal Boundary Description Acreage approx. 3 acres

Point A is 100 ft. east of the Intersection of the driveway and U. S. 150.
Beginning at point A on the south side of U.S.150, proceeding south along a fence 300 feet to point B, then 200' east along a line to the south (rear) of the kitchen and smoke house to point C., north along a fence 300' to point D on U.S. 150, west 200' along south of U.S.150 to the point of origin. The boundaries were drawn to include the house, lawn, and domestic-related space as enclosed by fences, the highway, and outbuildings. Two contributing outbuildings are included: a brick meathouse and a brick two-room outbuilding which appears to have been a kitchen. "Carriage" house apparently cut into north room east wall. Roof overhangs east front. Property includes three contributing buildings and two non-contributing buildings.
