

The livestock/equipment barn at the Louis N. Hilger Homestead is a two-story, wood frame, livestock/feed/equipment agricultural building. Its plan is transverse-crib with a side livestock stall shed. Its board-and-batten walls rest upon a continuous concrete foundation and a metal gambrel roof shelters the structure.

The northern or main elevation is accessed only via a large, central vehicular entry with a projecting hay hood above. The eastern elevation is lighted by two shed dormers projecting from the roof and three smaller, rectangular windows placed randomly in the shed wall below. The elevation is accessed via nine livestock doors that lead into the stalls behind. The southern elevation is blank with the exception of the central vehicular entrance, and the western elevation is lighted with two shed dormers and six square windows placed symmetrically in the wall below.

The interior of the barn is divided into five square stalls on each side of the central runway in the gambrel roof section and seven stalls in the eastern shed section. A large, open hay loft occupies the entire second story.

Significance

Criterion C, local significance

The livestock/equipment barn at the Louis N. Hilger Homestead is the best example in the county from this era of White County history (Boom and Bust: The War and Depression Years, 1914-1939; Section E,4) of a barn of this size and floor plan from the late 1930's. Its remarkable braced frame construction (consisting as it does of 4"-square beams for the walls and 2"x4" planks for the roof framing) allows for its extraordinary height. It is also one of the few barns of any type in the county to use dormers in lighting the hay loft.

The barn was constructed in 1939 to shelter the mules that Louis Hilger used as draught animals for his dairy business. It survives in excellent condition.


