STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The James Harwell House was built in the Greek revival style, frequently used for large homes in the antebellum \$outh. The original owner, William Rogers Johnson, was a man of varied interests and professions--a characteristic typical of the antebellum planter.

Architecture

The Greek revival was probably the most widely accepted style for large houses in the South until the War Between the States. The Harwell House, characteristic of the style, has a portico across the front and sides and twenty-two free-standing columns supporting a low pitched roof. The white painted columns, wooden facade and chimneys, as well as the strict symmetry of the building, is typical of Greek revival architecture. Corresponding to the image of the antebellum southern home, the Harwell House served as a model for the setting of the 1934 20th Century Fox production of "Carolina!".

All materials used in construction of the house came from the estate, originally owned by William Rogers Johnson. Bricks were manufactured on the grounds. The logs were hauled by oxcart to a sawmill in Cheraw and the lumber was floated down the Great Pee Dee River for construction of the house in 1857.

Political

William Rogers Johnson, original owner of the antebellum Greek revival house, served Marion District politically in both the South Carolina House of Representatives (1852 to 1856) and in the South Carolina Senate (1860 to 1864). He participated in the Southern Rights Conwention of 1852 and, continuing his political activity in the postwar period, served as a member of the Second Taxpayers Convention. This convention drafted and presented a petition to Congress for tax relief in 1874. Johnson also practiced the professions of physician and planter; he lived at the house at Mars Bluff from its construction in 1857 until his death thirty-six years later.
