Describe present and historic physical appearance.

Located in the Delphi Valley, once a verdant old growth forest, about seven miles southwest of Olympia, the Delphi School is a rectangular, one-story wood frame structure on a poured concrete foundation. Its gable roof is covered with composition shingles and has open eaves with exposed rafters and wide gable-end fascia boards supported by ornamental brackets. Walls are clad with drop siding and cornerboards. A hip roofed extension at the southeast corner holds the vestibule.

A full-width porch on the front (east) facade supported by turned posts shelters the main entry door. Because of dry rot, the porch has been recently replaced following the original configuration. To the right of the door are four small three-paned windows. Above the porch is a sign reading, "Delphi School - Dist. 313 - 1910-1942." Another porch along the south facade leading to an auxiliary door is a later addition. The north facade has a row of tall, narrow double-hung windows with six-over-six lights which are covered by hinged plywood panels. Prompted by vandalism, the rear of the structure which was the woodshed has been enclosed recently in compatible construction. The hipped roof belltower on the vestibule section has also been removed. The interior has the original vestibule, large classroom and book storage room. A new kitchen and bathrooms have been added at the rear. The building has its original beaded-board walls and blackboards. The schoolhouse is adjoined by the historic schoolyard, which is included in the nomination.

State significance of property, and justify criteria, criteria considerations, and areas and periods of significance noted above.

The Delphi School is historically significant for its association with public education in rural Thurston County and with the development of the small company town of Delphi. Built in 1910 on land donated by the Mud Bay Logging Company, the school was established to serve the children of employees of the company, one of the largest industries in the county during the period. The school was one of the few public structures built in association with the company and the only remaining structure from the settlement at Delphi. In 1942, one year after the company ceased operations, the school was closed. But the simple, one-room, gable roofed structure is well preserved, strongly conveys its historic character, and meets the registration requirement established for the property type in the Rural Public Schools multiple property documentation form.

<u>Historical Background</u>: Delphi was on the migratory route for Native Americans along the Chehalis-Black Lake-Puget Sound corridor. Early white settlers were Hudson's Bay employees who followed traditional Indian routes. First American settlers established donation land claims in the area and later homesteaded on open prairie lands. But not until large-scale logging began after the turn of century did population significantly increase in the valley. By 1910, the area was renamed by a local resident who saw it as "Land of the Gods."

Built on land donated by the Mud Bay Logging Company in 1910, the Delphi School was a one-room facility for eight grades. Two other schools in the area--located at North Star and Buckhorn--served the children of loggers, but both are now gone. The Mud Bay Logging Company established its operations in the Delphi area beginning in 1900, bringing an influx of population by 1910 and with it a store and post office. The original Delphi School, built about 1900, was located across the street from this structure but was replaced by the nominated structure in order to accommodate the increase in population. By 1919 Mud Bay Logging had exhausted nearby timber supplies and in 1941 shut down operations entirely. The school was closed the following year. The building is currently owned and maintained by the Delphi Community Club.
