



This house is significant for its architecture and its association with the exploration and settlement of the Bergen County, New Jersey area. It is a reasonably well preserved example of the Form/Plan Type as shown and more fully described herein. As such, it is included in the Thematic Nomination to the National Register of Historic Places for the Early Stone Houses of Bergen County, New Jersey.

Weirmus Road & Old Mill Road, Woodcliff Lake





A house was built here, on about 150 acres, about 1756 by Johannes Westervelt of Tenafly for his son Casparus, who inherited it when Johannes died 1770-71. Casparus died November 15, 1809 and his son Peter C. Westervelt inherited and owned it until 1846, when it was sold to Peter's son James P. Westervelt along with fourteen acres. James operated a grist mill and general store. In 1854 Garret J. Lydecker bought the property and continued the business.
