Paulina Lake Guard Station #1019: 1938; rectangular, 1 story, wood-frame, poured concrete foundation, wood-shingled medium gable roof, projecting offset gables, left on front elevation, light on rear elevation, gabled garage abuts right gable end, inset, stone interior chimney, arched cap, off center on ridgeline. Horizontal clapboard covers exterior walls to eave-level, vertical board and batten on all gable ends. Nine-and-twelve-light sashes in divisions of two with mullions. Mullion Window of three divisions of fifteen lights each in off-set gable, front elevation. Main entry, center, main facade, recessed in anterior wall; flagstone platform enclosed on three sides; entry surrounds formed by heavy squared timbers, flush with walls, heavy squared straight timber brackets, angled placement, extend from platform surface to lintel. Rear entry recessed, extreme left corner, rear elevation. Hinge-opening two-leaf garage doors off-center on exposed gable end of abutting garage. No decoration. No obvious structural or material alterations to exterior.

SIGNIFICANCE:

The Paulina Lake Guard Station typifies the construction projects undertaken by the Civilian Conservation Corps and signifies the aid to the local community provided by the emergency work-relief program through employment of youth and experienced craftsmen, purchase of building materials and camp supplies, and personal expenditures of enrollees. The property represents the Forest Service's presence in the locality, as intradistrict headquarters for field operation, and denotes, via the physical facilities required to carry out the

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agency's expanding responsibilities, the critical transition in the Service's development from custodial superintendence to extensive resource management. The Paulina Lake Guard Station exemplifies the rustic architectural idiom developed by the Forest Service, Pacific Northwest Region, to impart Forest Service identity and to represent its purposes and ideals; and signifies the agency's particular interpretation of a singular expression of early twentieth century American architectural thought. Possessing superior qualities of design and execution, the Guard Station is an excellent example of an architectural location invested with special aesthetic and associative values by the agency that created it.

VERBAL BOUNDARY DESCRIPTION:

Paulina Lake Guard Station

That portion of land lying within the SW 1/4 of the NE 1/4 of Section 34, T. 21S., R. 12E., Willamette Meridian in the County of Deschutes, State of Oregon, herein described:

Commencing at the center of Section 34, T. 21S., R. 12E., W.M., taking a backside on bearing tree in said center of Section 34, finding the bearing to be N 40° E for a measured distance of 40 feet to the True Point of Beginning. Thence N 0° W 75 feet to a point, thence S 88° E 75 feet to a point. Thence N 0° W 75' to a point, thence S 88° W 75 feet to the True Point of Beginning. Said piece of land contains .50 acres--more or less. All bearings and distances are calculated, and are subject to adjustment in actual field location.
