The Copperhill Historic District, in Copperhill, Polk County, Tennessee is a collection of primarily mid-1920s houses and churches which reflect architectural styles popular during the period, such as Colonial Revival and Bungalow. The dwellings in Copperhill line the steep hills which have streets running straight up them. The streets are narrow, and stone and concrete retaining walls delineate the yards from the streets.

Copperhill is primarily single family residential, although there are a few apartment buildings, and houses converted to boarding houses. The YMCA, built by the Tennessee Copper Company in 1925, is in the residential district, and dominates the view of it from Main Street. The district is about four blocks long and two blocks wide, and climbs the side of the hill which Copperhill is named for.

Residential construction in Copperhill is primarily frame, despite the fires which destroyed the town twice. They follow the stylistic elements of early 20th century styles, and have not been substantially altered since their construction.

The Copperhill Historic District, in Copperhill, Polk County, Tennessee is significant to the history and development of Copperhill for its architectural significance (criterion C) and for its relationship with the copper industry (criterion A) which built the city.

Copperhill was developed during the late stage of mining development after the railroad located in the area and after the Tennessee Copper Company located their headquarters in the city.

The copper industry, particularly the smelter and acid plant, were the economic base of the community, although after 1904 few of the upper management of the company lived in the town. The Copperhill Historic District contains both the residences of people who made their living indirectly from the industry--store owners, teachers, doctors, and industry employees. The residences of the Copperhill Historic District were all constructed and owned by individuals, not the copper company. The area was primarily middle class, and reflects the architectural styles which were popular with the middle class when the city was rebuilt in the 1920s.

The population of Copperhill grew in the 1920s as a result of modifications made to the Acid Plant (conversion to the No. 2 plant) to allow the plant to process more ore into sulfuric acid. During this period Copperhill experienced a small housing boom which, when combined with the fires of 1925, resulted in much of the community being constructed that year.

Building and sulfuric acid production both decreased slightly during the depression, although the copper industry was not as severely damaged as other industries were. Production continued throughout the depression, and federal programs such as the CCC aided in employing the youth of the area.

The Copperhill Historic District represents the best and largest collection of 1920s architecture in the Basin. The residential section of Ducktown developed earlier, and exhibits influences of earlier forms. The buildings in Copperhill have not been substantially altered and the area still conveys the same character that it did when it was constructed.

Verbal Boundary Description and Justification

The Copperhill Historic District is bounded on the south by Main Street, on the west by the rear property lines on the west side of Hill street, on the east by the rear property lines on the east side of Prospect Street, and on the north by a line following the rear property lines southeast until it intersects the eastern edge of the district. See Copperhill, Polk County, Tennessee Tax Map 136-E. The area nominated is the historic residential section of Copperhill and is the only collection of historic housing within the city. The boundaries were determined to exclude as many noncontributing resources as possible while including the historic housing.
