## History

By 1800 the original meeting house, built in 1766, had become too small for the congregation and plans were underway to erect a new and larger church. Funds for the new structure, designed to seat about 650 people, were raised one-quarter from taxes and three-quarters from the sale of the pews. Lavius Fillmore, employed as the architect and builder, drew very heavily on Plate 33 of Asher Benjamin's The Country Builder's Assistant (first published at Greenfield, Massachusetts in 1797) as the source of his plan. The only changes Fillmore introduced in the Benjamin plan were the Palladian windows in the first stage of the tower, the round top of the doors, and the round-headed windows in the upper tier of the main structure. Construction began on June 25, 1804 and the first service in the new church was held on January 1, 1806. The carving was done by Asa Hyde, a skilled craftsman brought from Connecticut for this purpose. Total cost of construction was \$7793.20.

## Significance

The First Congregational Church of Bennington is probably Vermont's finest example of a frame church designed in the <u>late</u> Georgian or Federal-Adamesque style. The structure is located at the western approach to the village and serves as the visual nucleus of the architecturally rich district of Old Bennington.
