Description: The Superintendent's Residence is a two-story masonry and stucco building in the Spanish-Pueblo Revival style. It has a flat roof with rounded parapets, and recessed metal casement windows with exposed wood lintels. The main entrance porch has round wood columns and corbels. Exterior details include a small wood balcony on the SE side of the building, and vigas extending through the outside walls between the first and second story. There has been an addition on the rear of the building, and the entire building was renovated in 1978 by Architect Charles Nolan. The original architect is unknown. The building dates from 1906, but portions of the building are believed to date before 1906. The original building was constructed in an "L" shape and retains its architectural integrity.

Statement of Significance, Criterion C: The Superintendent's Residence is one of four buildings on the campus of the New Mexico School for the Deaf included in this Nomination. All buildings at NMSD are designed in the Spanish Pueblo Revival Style. The Superintendent's Residence is significant

because it is the oldest building on campus, some portion of the building is thought to date from before 1906, and a residence stood at the present location when the school was authorized by the Territorial Government in 1887. Originally a farmhouse, this building is a very early example of Pueblo Revival Style architecture that has become well known as a New Mexican architectural style and made famous by architects such as John Gaw Meem and Gordon Street who worked for Meem prior to opening his own firm 1937. Street designed many of the buildings at NMSD. The Spanish Pueblo Revival Style of this building set the style for all buildings constructed at NMSD to present.

Verbal boundary description and justification: On the lands of the New Mexico School for the Deaf from the eastern entrance off Cerrillos Rd., proceed north 60 feet; turn NE and proceed 80 feet to the south corner of the Superintendent's Residence. Using the south corner of the building as the point of beginning continue NE 45 feet to the east corner of the building; turn NW and proceed 65 feet to the north corner of the building; turn SW and proceed 45 feet to the west corner of the building; turn SE and proceed 65 feet to the point of origin (note: this verbal boundary description is not a legal filed description for the Superintendent's Residence. This description is the area around the building measured and described for the Historic Register generally using a landmark as a beginning and ending point for easier reference).
