Describe the present and original (if known) physical appearance

Hostetler's Opera House is located in Minden (1985 Pop.: 2,939), Nebraska, the county seat of Kearney County. The three-story brick commercial building, which represents a fine example of the late Renaissance Revival Style, was constructed in 1891 by W. T. Thorne. The main level currently houses retail businesses and the second level is vacant. A local group is interested in leasing/purchasing the building with plans to include a rehabilitation of the second floor for use as a dance hall and meeting place. Structural and historical integrity have been preserved except for alterations made to the street level facades and interior modifications which occurred in past years.

Hostetler's Opera House is located in the downtown business district of Minden, Nebraska. The three-story commercial building, designed in the late Renaissance Revival Style, was constructed in 1891 by W. T. Thorne, and is rectangular-shaped in plan and rests on a brick foundation. The front outer facade consists of four buttresses which divide the facade into three equal bays. Each bay contains six equally spaced windows, with the upper row having pedimented hoods and the lower having linteled hoods. The center bay displays a round-arched plaque which reads, "Hostetler's Opera House 1891." The center top row windows are arched as is the door at the bottom center of this upper level. The door, now enclosed, originally opened onto a front balcony, which is evidenced by lighter colored brick expanding across the width of the building. On the back (north) side of the building, a piece of heavy timber extends from the roof area which was originally used with a block and tackle to lift heavy objects to the second level.

Distinctive interior features of the opera house include detail woodwork around doorways, decorative capitals on supporting columns, and the oak floor that was added in 1919. The original ticket office displays old wallpaper and advertisements for past events. The pressed tin wainscoating in the hallway on the second floor adds historical character to this area as also does the original ticket window. Pressed tin also lined the back stairwell until it was recently removed. Large six-paneled double oak doors leading to the main hall are intact.

Remnants of a bygone era include old chairs originally used in the opera house, a piano, and a stand which announced upcoming dances.

A local group is in the process of wanting to convert the upper level into a useable space for square dancing and meetings. There is also strong community support to preserve the Opera House. The building is presently being stabilized with preservation/rehabilitation plans to begin in the near future.

### Statement of Significance (in one paragraph)

Hostetler's Opera House is architecturally significant on a local level as a good example of a 19th Century opera house block, a building type which played an important part in the cultural life of small towns in Nebraska. Stylistically, the building is a fine example of the late Renaissance Revival style in the state. Today these structures serve as architectural landmarks and contribute to civic pride. The Hostetlers' were significant in governmental, political and business circles of early Buffalo County and Kearney County in Nebraska. Bruno O. Hostetler was a prominent lawyer and mayor in the County. He also served 37 years as District Judge. The period of significance (1891) is derived from the construction date of the building.

Hostetler's Opera House attains local significance in the area of architecture as an example of an opera house block, a building type which was evident in Nebraska during the late 19th and early 20th centuries, and which played an important part in the development of social activities in Nebraska. This building is an excellent example of a Main Street opera house, still intact, that can be found in small Nebraska towns. These opera house blocks were designed to incorporate office and retail space on the lower levels, with the auditorium occupying the top story. The building served as a meeting place for community social, political and cultural events. Formally and stylistically the building conveys architectural significance for the period of construction. Representative of the finest opera house traditions, the strict symmetry and the raised parapet reinforce the <u>public</u> formal nature of the building. Stylistically the building is a very fine example of the late Renaissance Revival in Nebraska, a style reserved primarily for dignified public functions. The building's date of construction marks it as one of the earliest uses of this style for public halls in Nebraska.

Bruno O. Hostetler came to Nebraska in 1887 after studying law at the University of Iowa, in Iowa City. In June of 1887 he settled in Kearney. In November he went back to Iowa to marry his fiance Margaret Belle Miller. They then returned to Kearney to make their permanent home.

B. O. Hostetler practiced law in Buffalo County for six years. Politics and public affairs were important all his life. He served as mayor in Kearney for three years. From January, 1904 to January, 1941 he served as Judge of the 12th Judicial District of Nebraska. His 37-year term of office was the longest of the District before or since. He had a statewide reputation for "prompt disposition of pending cases and for keeping his docket clear." Records show that as District Judge, less than three percent of his decisions were appealed to the Supreme Court. Thus he was termed the "fearless" and "fair" Judge.

Judge Hostetler was active in Kearney in securing a public library for the city and also in getting the State Normal School for Kearney. His wife was active in club and social circles and was a noted artist in the area.
