Describe the present and original (if known) physical appearance

The McKenzie House (1860) is a frame, two-story, provincial Greek Revival town residence located near the center of the parish seat of Homer. Despite several changes, the house retains its National Register eligibility.

The McKenzie House has a central hall plan, one room deep, with a story-and-a-half rear dining room wing. Between the rear wing and the main body of the house there is a second hall which contains the staircase.

The front of the house is encompassed by a broadly proportioned Doric gallery consisting of four colossal fluted columns and a full entablature. The facade itself has five bays with a central entrance on each story. Both entrances feature double doors, a transom, and side lights. The second story also features a cantilevered balcony with a wooden wheat sheaf style balustrade. The side entrance to the aforementioned rear hall features a two column pedimented portico. Other noteworthy exterior details include the crude modillions, the pilasters with capitals and bases on many of the windows and doors, and the drain spouts which feature the date of the house.

The interiors are large and plain with few noteworthy details. All the doors feature four flat panels and most of the windows are six over six.

The following changes have occurred in the house since construction:

- (1) The single story rear porch has been enclosed.
- (2) The mantels and the chimneys have been lost.
- (3) Closets have been installed in some of the rooms.

<u>Assessment of Integrity:</u>

Despite these changes, the McKenzie House retains its major Greek Revival elements (see Item 8), which are the basis of its architectural significance.

Statement of Significance (in one paragraph) Criterion C

The McKenzie House is locally significant in the area of architecture as one of the finest residential examples of Greek Revival architecture in northern Louisiana.

The superiority of the McKenzie House can be seen if one examines the average Greek Revival residence in the northern part of the state. Typically, it is a single story five-bay cottage with a square post gallery and simple details. By contrast, the McKenzie House has a colossal galleried facade with fluted columns as well as a pedimented portico on the side. In addition, much of the fenestration features pilasters with capitals and bases.




