## DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The building has had a number of alterations, however, these have been more in the form of expansion rather than changing the original plan which is essentially a very long rectangle. The alterations have expanded the back of the building now giving it a T-shaped plan.

The material is mostly concrete gravel which is exposed, while the balustrades and cornices and other ornament are painted white.

The main entrance is dominated by a square clock tower, which like the rest of the building has a red tiled roof.

The ornament and style of the building is typical of many structures to be found in Puerto Rico at the turn of the century — the utilization of more modern material such as concrete and adopting a mixture of decorative elements which create a Puerto Rican adaptation of neoclassical. The plan and proportions are an attempt at neoclassical symmetry and simplicity, along with the balustrades and the columns and ornament framing the windows, doors and the tower. However, these are then mixed with the roofing tile of Mediterranean character and detail ornamentation which is closer to the Moorish.

The alterations of the windows to the miami aluminium louvers as well as the additional wing which is totally devoid of any ornament have contributed to the deterioration of the quality of the character of the structure. The air-conditioning units are also an unnecessary intrusion. The general effect is not ecclectic but almost a 'bastardization'.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This structure has a historical significance rather than architectural. It was the first extension of the University of Puerto Rico from San Juan to the west coast of the island, the second campus to be created, and the first educational institution on the island to offer training in the agricultural field, and later in mechanical engineering. The University of Puerto Rico was founded in 1903, and this building symbolizes the 'second earliest university' dating 1911. The first building erected on the site was demolished by an earthquake in 1912.

The University at Mayaquez wishes to restore certain aspects of this building, such as the original wood shutters which were in the original section of the building.
