NARRATIVE DESCRIPTION

Fairview Place is a historic subdivision located in Phoenix, Arizona, northwest of the downtown and north of the State Capitol. The district is bounded by McDowell Road on the south, Encanto Boulevard on the north, 15th Avenue on the east and the alley behind 17th Avenue on the west. The neighborhood is situated between the Arizona State Park Fairgrounds, immediately west and Encanto Park to the east.

Fairview Place is laid out longitudinally with four major streets: 15th Avenue; Laurel Avenue; 16th Avenue; and 17th Avenue, running north and south. These blocks are intersected midpoint by Palm Lane. This rectilinear street layout set it apart from nearby residential areas. The lots are oriented east to west, except for the handful that front along McDowell Road. The subdivision was originally platted with lots 25 feet wide and 145 deep. However, most homes were built upon two lots creating a predominant pattern of lot widths of 50 feet. A few larger lots, which were created by combining three of the original subdivision lots, are interspersed on blocks and at the corners along Palm Lane. All streets have sidewalks and tree lawns. Street trees lost over time have recently been replanted as part of neighborhood residents' efforts to preserve the areas historic residential character.

Along the north-south streets, the district is almost exclusively small, one-story single-family dwellings. McDowell Road frontage includes several early homes converted to commercial uses as well as historic era oneand two-story apartment complexes and commercial buildings.

Architecturally, the 340 properties that make up the district represent the builder's versions of styles popular during the first half of the twentieth century. Indicative of its period of development, the district includes only one example of the Bungalow. This small brick structure was built in 1928 with approximately a dozen other early homes that were constructed by the Mathieson Construction Company. Three homes from this era of building are Tudor Revival houses with characteristic steep pitched gabled roofs, entry vestibules, half timbering or contrasting trim. The remaining Period Revival-influenced homes exhibit features illustrative of the southwestern regional building. Locally known as the "Southwest" style, these builder's homes combine elements of the Pueblo, Spanish Colonial and Monterey Revival styles. These homes feature flat and gable roofs set off with red tile. Their simple rectangular and square plans appear more complex with the use of small wing walls or porte cocheres. Exterior stucco walls occasionally include vigas, canales, or arched openings.

Several unusual styles also appear in Fairview Place. Interspersed among the Period Revival homes are six examples of Tudor-derived cottages constructed of native tufa stone, quarried northeast of Phoenix near Pinnacle Peak. These typically have a round stone arch which opens into a gabled entry pavilion. Their design and construction are attributed to an independent contractor H.T. Evans. Fairview Place also features three Moderne style homes, easily distinguished by their rectilinear forms, corner steel windows and flat roofs. One of these homes appears to have been built as early as 1929. Their presence indicates that architectural trends other than the Period Revival movement were also influencing the architecture of Phoenix during the 1930s.

The majority of the homes in the Fairview Place Historic District are Ranch style. They include the range of building which was done as this important twentieth century residential architectural style emerged and developed. Approximately 45% are representative of the early or transitional ranch style. Also known as the Minimal Traditional house, these small homes are simple, one-story structures with low to medium pitched gable roofs. Their box-like form is laid out in square, rectangular or L-shaped plans. The majority of the Fairview Place ranches are constructed of brick, both painted and exposed. Some stucco exteriors also are found. For the most part,houses in this category are devoid of ornament or decorative treatment, indicative of the rising popularity of the modern styles during this period, as well as the influences on the building industry for standardization, economy and efficiency in construction. However, illustrative of its transitional link with earlier Period Revival style building, some detailing is found with various roof and eave treatments, such as exposed rafters or molded cornices. Windows are both wood and steel casement, sometimes set off with shutters. Simple porches are consistently found including corner or small projecting entry porches, as well as those that span the full or half width of the facade. Porch supports are almost always simple wooden posts, occasionally in multiple groupings or embellished by lattice work.

A large subset of the Ranch style homes in Fairview Place can be categorized as French Provincial Ranches. Dating form the mid-1940s, these one-story, hipped roof structures are more complex in form and appearance than the simpler early ranch forms. The complexity is achieved through the use of multiple, low-pitched roofs and projecting bays and ells to create slightly irregular floor plans. Like the early Ranch, the French Provincial Ranches are predominantly painted brick sometimes sheathed with stucco. Steel casement windows are most prevalent, although some double-hung wood sash and picture and corner windows can also be found. A variety of treatments at the roof and wall juncture are employed. Eaves are both open and closed with simple fascia trim or cornice molding. Porches also are an important element of the facade, ranging in location, size and form. The variation in these basic architectural features and simple detailing create diversity among these modest mid-twentieth century homes.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Fairview Place Historic District is historically significant under Criterion "A" for its excellent representation of the national influences associated with the Depression and World War II which shaped local and regional development and building practices. It also is architecturally important under Criterion "C" for its illustrations of the transition in the prevalence of architectural styles that occurred as a result of the increased influence of federal housing policies and regulation during the 1930s and 1940s.

Fairview Place was originally subdivided in 1916 by the State Realty and Sales Company. The investment company had ambitious plans and lots in Fairview Place were heavily promoted in a variety of ways. One promotion involved the distribution of coupons, discounting the lot purchase price, through downtown stores. Despite these incentives, the lots did not sell and no homes were constructed in the area by the State Realty and Sales Company. This can probably be attributed to several local conditions at that time. The Fairview Place subdivision was located on land vulnerable to periodic flooding from the Cave Creek Wash. It was located outside the city limits of Phoenix and was not readily accessible by streetcar or paved roads. Consequently, competing subdivisions to the east and south, which had infrastructure improvements and amenities, attracted and accommodated the demand for housing at this time. The outbreak of World War I was a national influence that also had an effect on local construction activity.

In 1928, when housing demand in Phoenix soared, real estate activity in Fairview Place reemerged. By this time, the completion of Cave Creek Dam had resolved the flooding concerns and the competing developments to the east were almost completely built up. The automobile had become more widely used, so streetcar access was not as important for home buyers. F.W. Mathiesen, head of the Mathiesen Construction Company, had purchased Fairview Place with plans to build fifty houses in 1928 for which they would serve as the exclusive sales agent. The company's proposal was consistent with the trend of speculative investment and construction which was occurring as part of residential development in the late 1920s.

As Phoenix's west side became a more viable market for residential building, the promotional advertisements boasted that "Everything Points to Fairview Place." Still outside the city limits, the subdivision now offered gravel streets and city water and lights. Homes, designed in the Period Revival styles popular in the larger community, were claimed to be "a distinct social and business asset." As a result of these marketing efforts, nine homes were completed in 1928 and another 18 were added to the area by 1932. Unfortunately, the economic impact of the Depression was in force in Phoenix by 1932 and the lofty ambitions of the Mathiesen Construction Company in Fairview Place never materialized.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE (cont'd)

Construction did not begin again in Fairview Place until the late 1930s. Like other areas in the community and across the nation, this activity was directed related to federal involvement in the housing industry. The creation of the Federal Housing Administration (FHA) by the 1934 National Housing Act served as an important stimulus for building in several ways. By insuring private lenders against loss on mortgage loans, financing for home construction became more widely available. Reflective of the record number of FHA loans in Phoenix at this time, 74 new homes were erected in Fairview Place in 1938 and 1939. By 1940, the phrase "built and approved under FHA" was common in Fairview Place real estate advertisements.

Building under the auspices of the FHA ushered in a new phase in both development practices and the architectural styling in Fairview Place and in Phoenix. With the ability to offer long term mortgages with fixed affordable monthly payments, more and more homes were built on speculation. Two of the most prolific homebuilders in the Phoenix metropolitan area both lived and constructed homes in Fairview Place. Principals of the Andy Womack Building Company, Andy Womack lived at 1702 North 17th Avenue and his bother, J.R. Womack, lived at 1714 North Laurel Avenue. Alfred Anderson of Maxwell and Anderson constructed his house at 1809 North Laurel Avenue in 1939. These firms established their reputations by building in accordance with the FHA policies and standards, which were being promulgated during this time. Utilizing large scale house building operations reduced construction costs and uniformity in design and style, the work undertaken by the Womacks and Maxwell and Anderson were a dramatic departure from the building of earlier eras. Setting a precedent for how subdivisions would be designed, marketed and built, they had a significant effect on the character of the subsequent residential areas that emerged during the mid-Twentieth Century.

World War II brought the local building boom to a complete halt. Although houses were still under construction at the beginning of the war, the impact of war-related restrictions produced a steady decline in new house starts. Evidence of this influence is the fact that not a single home was constructed in Fairview Place in 1944. However, with the passage of the "G.I. Bill" that same year, Fairview Place and Phoenix experienced an immediate surge of home building related to the loan guarantees and 100 percent financing that was made available to veterans. Servicemen from Williams and Luke Air Force Bases and other military facilities in the region returned in droves to settle in the warm climate of Arizona. Indicative of this population influx, 28 homes were built in Fairview Place in 1945, 22 in 1946 and 15 in 1947. Although the post World War II building boom waned from that year on, 95% percent of the development of Fairview Place was complete by the decade's end.

The significance of the Fairview Place Historic District and its excellent representation of historic themes and architectural influences important to the development of Phoenix was formally recognized in February 1994 with the local designation of the district on the Phoenix Historic Property Register.

Recent close inspection by the staff of the Arizona State Historic Preservation Office has revealed that the house has been significantly altered with the application of non-historic board and batten siding and slump block wainscotting. The property no longer conveys the material characteristics that would identify it as a 1940s French Provincial Ranch design. This house should no longer be considered historically and architecturally significant as defined by the contexts of the 1994 nomination. Attached is a copy of a letter from the City of Phoenix Historic Preservation Office, which oversaw the original nomination, agreeing that the property should be considered a non-contributor.



The above-referenced property was listed as a contributor to the Fairview Place Historic District, Phoenix, Maricopa County, Arizona.

The house at 1837 N. Laurel Avenue was listed as a contributor in the nomination sent to the Keeper in 1994. Since that time, the property has been modified by the removal of the distinctive, scalloped gable trim. This change, along with the previous removal of the original windows, has resulted in a substantial loss of integrity that renders the property no longer eligible for the National Register. Attached are photographs of the property.

The Arizona SHPO requests the Keeper to add the house at 1837 N. 17th Avenue to the Contributor list as it again contributes to the historic fabric of the district and to remove the house at 1837 N. Laurel from the Contributor list as it is no longer a contributor to the historic fabric of Fairview Place Historic District.

The Fairview Place Historic District was listed in the National Register of Historic Places on 21 December 1994. This amendment was prepared from information provided by homeowners in the district.

As all of the lots in the Fairview Place Historic District (excepting one at 2029 N. 17th Ave.) are developed, this request will complete consideration of the contributing / noncontributing status of properties within the district. The lot at 2002 N. 17th Ave. once had a historic home but the lot was purchased to clear space for the east entrance of the State Fair Grounds and the house removed. It is expected that this lot will not be redeveloped anytime soon.

The original designation period was limited to homes built up to 1947, when servicemen returning to Arizona after World War II were receiving veterans' benefits and government financing to aid in construction. Nearly all (95%) of the lots in Fairview Place were developed by 1950. However, several privately owned residences built subsequent to the 1947 limitation are representative of the prevalent architectural styles in the district. They are consistent with surrounding home styles and have maintained their architectural integrity. The historic and architectural contexts of these properties are connected to that described in the *Historic Residential Subdivisions and Architecture in Central Phoenix*, 1912-1950 Multiple Property Documentation Form.

The original registration form for the district lists thirty-three (33) noncontributing properties. Since the original listing, three corrections were submitted and approved by the Keeper of the National Register. These corrections reclassified two properties (1801 N. 17th Ave. and 2033 N. Laurel Ave.) from contributors to noncontributors, and reclassified one property (1617 W. Encanto Blvd.) from a noncontributor to a contributor. One correction also removed the address of 2023 N. Laurel from the noncontributor list (this was presumably a typo, meant to be 2033 N. Laurel Ave. since the 2023 address does not exist). These changes would leave the district with 294 contributors and 33 noncontributors. However, Section 5 of the nomination states that there are 316 contributors and 24 noncontributors. The numbers do not match the number of properties on the map of the district. The Arizona SHPO has noted several such errors in several district nominations prepared by the City of Phoenix. The Arizona SHPO is slowly working to correct these errors as its resources permit.]

While some of these properties date to the years 1951-1953, historically and architecturally, they represent no departure from the previous pattern of building in the neighborhood. All are comparable in style and massing to earlier properties that are listed as contributors (see attached photodocumentation). 

I am responding to your letter concerning the integrity of the property at 1801 North 17th Avenue. A member of our staff has inspected the property. The 1940s form of the house identifies it as a French Provincial Ranch design, but it is clear that the existing board and batten siding and slump block wainscoting is not original historic fabric. This current sheathing does have a negative effect on the integrity of materials and historic appearance of the house. We, therefore, concur with the position that this residence should be considered as a non-contributing property for the purposes of the National Register of Historic Places listing.

Please advise the homeowner that the National Register status of "non-contributor" is a separate issue from the fact that the house is designated on the Phoenix Historic Property Register and can take advantage of any programs offered by Phoenix Historic Preservation Office.





The siding has been recently removed, returning the house to its original wood siding. Please add the property at 1837 N. 17th Avenue to the Contributor list of the Fairview Place Historic District as it is once again a contributor to the historic fabric of the district.

The property at 1837 N. Laurel Avenue was originally listed as a Contributor to the Fairview Place Historic District. It has recently been modified by the removal of the scalloped gable trim. This change, along with the previous replacement of the original windows, has resulted in a significant loss of integrity. Please remove the house at 1837 N. Laurel from the Contributor list as it no longer contributes to the fabric of Fairview Place.

The Fairview Place Historic District was listed in the National Register of Historic Places on December 21, 1994. The original period of significance was listed as from 1928-1947. However, the neighborhood was completely built out by 1953 with little stylistic differences between those houses built before 1947 and those built after 1947 up until 1953. Due to this fact and the fact that several small errors have been found in the previous documentation, this amendment has been prepared by the Arizona State Historic Preservation Office to amend the period of significance to 1928-1953 and to correct any previous errors. The new resource count for the Fairview Place Historic District is 321 contributing buildings and 17 non-contributing buildings.

The Arizona State Historic Preservation Office asks that the Keeper amend the nomination for the Fairview Place Historic District to reflect the aforementioned changes. Required documentation accompanies this letter.

The Arizona SHPO has received inquiries from several property owners in the Fairview Place Historic District regarding our state property tax reduction program. To be eligible for this program for the coming year (2001), properties must be listed on the National Register (or be a contributing property to a listed historic district) by December 31 of this year. Therefore, the Arizona SHPO asks that, if possible, this amendment be certified by December 31, 2000 so that we may add these properties to our state tax program.


