DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Alexander building is a two-story structure with white terra cotta veneer, rendere in the Second Rennaissance Revival style. Both facades of this corner building have centered inset entries and plate glass windows. The mezzanine windows have been painted over. Doric pilasters demarcate the first story bays. A canopy extends from the ninth street entry.

The second story is distinguished by Ionic pilasters, squared-topped and round arched windows and a wrought iron mock balcony with a centered initial letter "A". The round arched windows have modillion-like keystones and the balcony is supported by garlanded brackets. The building terminates with a denticulated cornice with a parapet accented at the corners. The name "Alexander" is inscribed in the frieze and raised shields with the letter "A" decorate the parapet.

A frieze and cavetto separate the first and second stories. Discs ornament the frieze as does a wreathed oval plaque over the Main Street entry.

There are no additions or alterations other than block-letter signing on the mezzanine windows.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Alexander building is architecturally significant as one of Idaho's best examples of the second Rennaissance Revival style applied to a commercial building. The terra cotta veneer with its high quality of design and attention to detail further makes this building worthy of preservation.

Alexander's Men's Store was founded by Moses Alexander, who served as mayor of Boise and governor of Idaho. He holds the distinction of being the first Jewish governor in the nation. His clothing stores occupied a number of different locations in Boise from 1890 onward. This building, erected in 1924, served as the company's main store, offices and warehouse until 1975 when the Redevelopment Agency purchased the property. The Alexander family still operates their company.

In 1924 the Union Pacific decided to place Boise on its main line. This in part prompted Moses Alexander to build this structure in a period of agricultural depression. He proclaimed a "confidence in Boise's future" and desired "something new in architectural construction"¹ in the city. This shining white terra cotta building was the result of that desire. It remains a unique architectural statement in downtown Boise and a community and commercial landmark.
