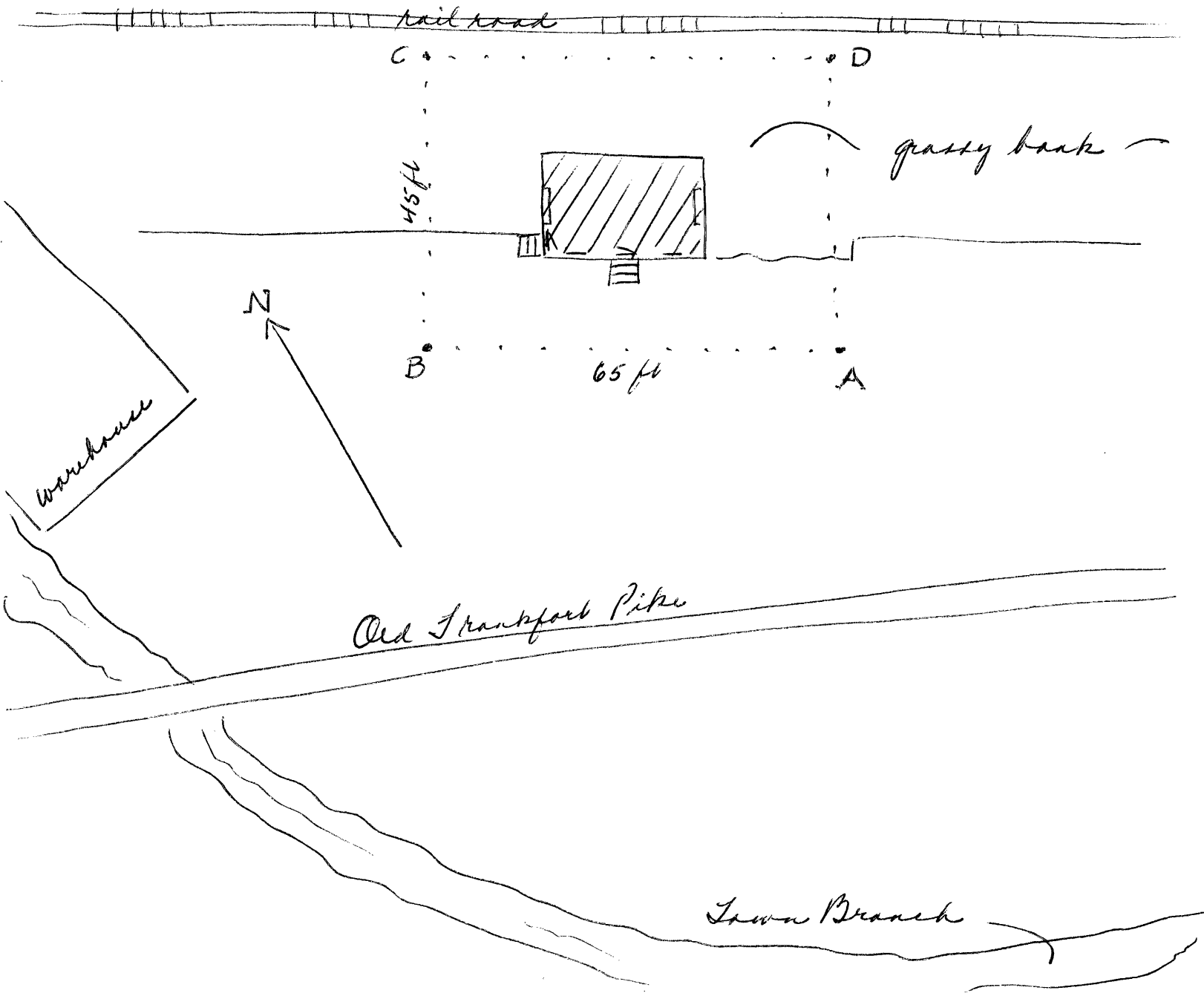

VERBAL BOUNDARY DESCRIPTION & JUSTIFICATION

Beginning at A, a point 21 ft diagonally S of the house, thence westerly parallel to house wall 65 ft to B, thence N 45 ft to C, thence along rail road 65 ft E to D, thence S 45 ft to the beginning - 2925 square feet.

This boundary includes only the space immediately around the house, which is surrounded by a parking lot, railroad,

and warehouse. The bank into which the house is built is the only green space.
