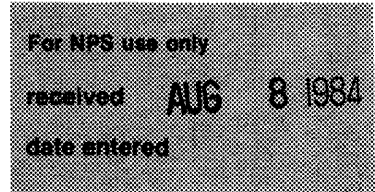

THIRD STREET DISTRICT: DESCRIPTION

The Third Street District is a small residential district occupying three corners of the intersection of Third Street and Scott Avenue. All the houses were built between 1910 and 1920 and are the American Four Square style, a variation of Classical Revival. Their homogeneity in terms of detailing is very apparent with the hip roofs, overhanging eaves, raised first floors, and symmetrical layout. Three of the four houses have wrap around porches supported by battered brick piers or paired Tuscan columns.

THIRD STREET DISTRICT: SIGNIFICANCE

The Third Street District is Pikeville's best example of early 20th century residential architecture. The houses here are also part of one of Pikeville's first subdivisions. The boom of commercial construction in the central business district after the arrival of the railroads created a need for additional housing.

THIRD STREET DISTRICT: BOUNDARY

Beginning at a point in the northwest corner of the intersection of Scott Avenue and Third Street; proceeding southwest 180 feet to the southwest property line of 417 Third Street; turning northwest with the property line of 417 Third 70 feet to a point in the rear property line of 417; then 240 feet northeast to Scott Avenue along the northwest line of 310 Scott; then turning southeast 260 feet crossing Third Street; then southwest 160 feet to the point of beginning.

THIRD STREET DISTRICT: JUSTIFICATION



The residential neighborhood surrounding the Third Street District is composed of more modern structures and older structures with significant modifications to the original style, mostly siding.

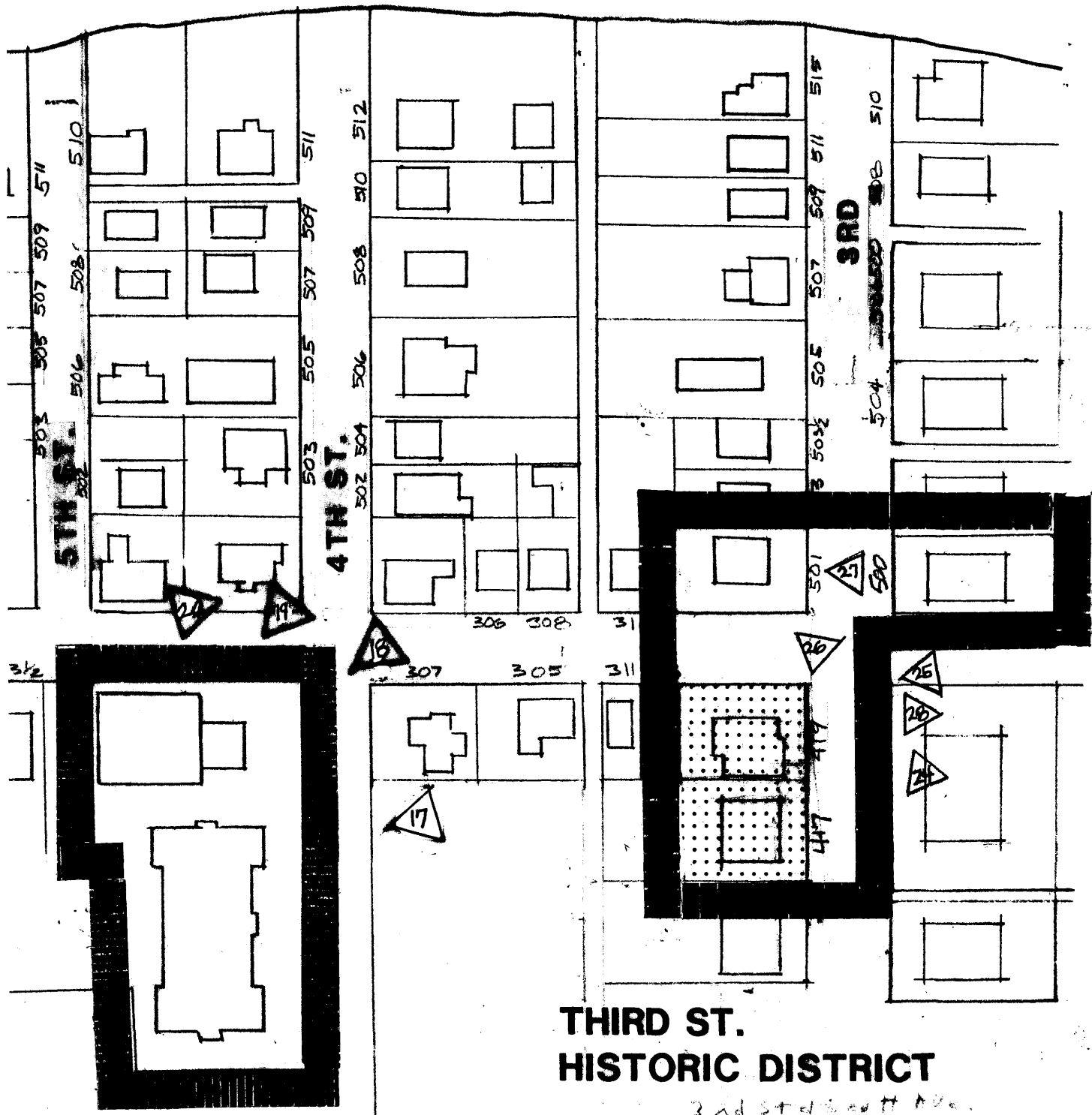
