This boundary increase to the existing Belfast Historic District (N.R. 8/21/86) involves a single building, the Colonial Theater, located at 121 High Street in Belfast's central business district. It abuts the Phoenix Row block which is presently located in the district; the boundary line thereby separating the two buildings. The boundary increase will not change the physical characteristics of the district, except for the addition of a Moderne style building to its already rich display of nineteenth and twentieth century architecture.

Fronting on High Street and facing southwest, the Colonial Theater is a tall one-story Moderne style brick building whose symmetrically composed five-bay facade is covered in what was described in 1947 as "California Stucco". Its wide recessed center bay contains a trio of double entrance doors flanked on the south side by the glass enclosed ticket window. Sheltering the entrance is the projecting marguee whose Colonial Revival style broken swan's neck pediment with center urn is somewhat incongruous against the Moderne styling of the wall surface behind. This design includes two movie advertisement windows on each side of the entry, a wide band at the edges and across the top formed from three narrower tiered moldings, and a broad false front centrally positioned behind the marquee and rising above the line of the band.

The theater's existing appearance is the result of a 1947 remodeling of a Classical Revival structure which was built in 1923-24 from designs by the Bangor architect Frederick A. Patterson. The earlier building, whose brick sidewalls and endwall are still visible from the rear, had a considerably different fenestration pattern, although the projection of its central bay above the roof line of the side bays was retained in spirit in the remodeling.

This boundary increase will draw into the Belfast Historic District the Colonial Theater, the last significant commercial building in this block of High Street. It will not result in a change to the UTM coordinates which define the general limits of the district.

The Colonial Theater is an important local example of late Moderne style architecture, and it is one of a small number of relatively unaltered historic movie theaters in Maine which date from the second quarter of the twentieth century. It adjoins the Phoenix Row block at 109-111 High Street which is presently located within the boundary of the Belfast Historic District.

Although the remodeling of the theater was undertaken less than fifty years ago (1947), exceptional significance as defined by Criteria Consideration G does not need to be met since the overwhelming majority of the resources in the district achieved significance more than fifty years ago. The original nomination submitted in 1986 defined the period of significance as being from 1800 through 1900--. Within this period of significance the majority of contributing resources date from the 1800s. However, there are a number of important twentieth century properties in the district including the Pierce School (1915), the William G. Crosby High School (1923), and the District Courthouse (1929-30). Within this context, therefore, the Colonial Theater represents a continuum in the district's development.

The Colonial Theater was established in Belfast in 1912, and it was originally housed in a brick building that was destroyed by fire in February of 1923. An article which appeared in the August 9, 1924, edition of *The Republican Journal* (Belfast) reported on the plans of the Famous Players Lasky Company of New York to rebuild the Colonial at a projected cost of between \$75,000 -- 100,000. Bangor architect Frederick A. Patterson designed the new theater in a Classical Revival mode, and it reopened on January 14, 1924. In its edition of June 19, 1947, *The Republican Journal* announced that extensive repairs to the theater had been completed, further noting that renovations had been scheduled as early as 1941, but that the advent of World War II had forced the postponement of this undertaking. It went on to say that "...the residents of Belfast may take pride in the fact that their city now has one of the safest, most modern, and most attractive theaters in the State of Maine." The theater continues to operate, and it remains an important part of the mix of commercial enterprises which sustain the historic business center of Belfast.
