
Front elevation wall splays out below roof at south-west corner.

Small square casement in the 2nd bay flanked by triple casement west & paired casement east.


High hipped roof section comes forward above the entrance, flanked by small diamond paned window to the left (west) in the 4th bay; wall around entrance shows patterned brick panels between half-timber work.

Wing extends, forming L on south-east corner; exterior end chimney shows broad base w/slate finished sloping roof to the south & paired casements on the west elevation.

Single & paired casements in small shed roof dormers - large hipped roof dormer above entrance.





