Two story, three bay, hall parlor dry stone house, ca. 20 x 32. Exterior chimneys each end, flanked by square attic windows. Had exterior doors on ends of house also. Masonry in regular courses, large stones, best work on W front; steeply pointed, white mortar. Voussoirs above openings; transoms front and rear doors; square stone door sills; water table. Cellar windows on E side only, have no bars or voussoirs. Pegged frames, ovolo trim. Enclosed corner stair on partition wall, arises from E wall, has batten door. Interior trim ovolo also. Mantels and chair rail gone.

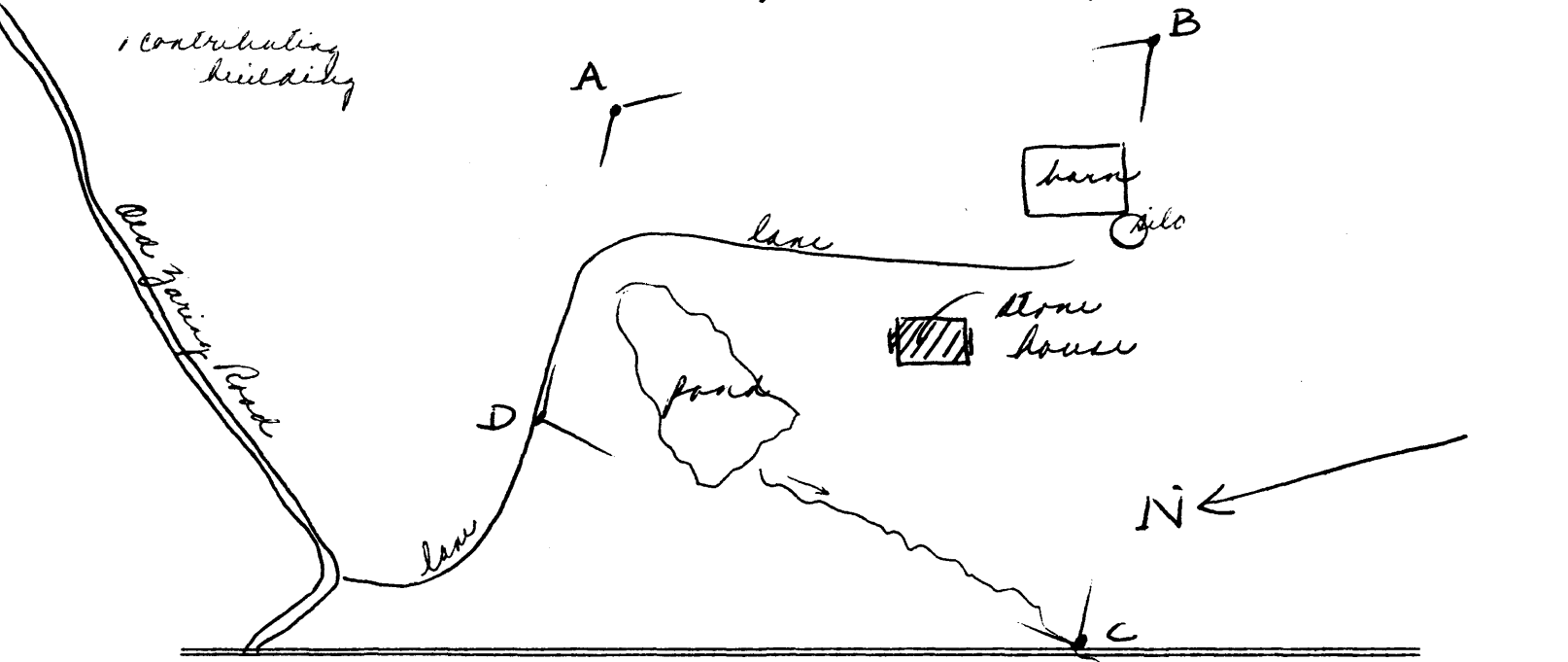

Beginning at A, NE of the house, thence S 787 ft to B, thence W 1017 ft to C, thence N 984 ft to D at the lane, thence E 590 ft to the beginning, containing the stone house, pond and head of branch, formerly a spring. Boundary chosen to include that portion of the original farm still in traditional agricultural use. Corners C and D are on the branch and on the lane. Barn and silo non-contributing.
