DESCRIPTION:

This one-story frame rectangular house has clapboard siding and a hipped over-hang roof with enclosed rafters and cornice. It faces west with an off-centered door on the west. There is another wooden, off-centered door on the east. On the west is a centered open portico with two posts, and the recessed porch on the east has been enclosed. There are two double-hung sash windows with two over two lights on each side. The foundation, probably stone, is covered by vertical wood siding. Alterations include a metal roof, concrete block chimney, vertical siding over the foundation, and enclosure of the recessed porch on the southeast corner.

SIGNIFICANCE:

This 20' x 28' house was constructed in 1908 at a cost of \$844. It was one of fourteen Potlatch houses constructed in 1908 after the company determined that those built in the initial construction period of 1906-1907 were not sufficient to house all of the work force. Although it has been altered slightly, this house still retains much of its original integrity, and is the best-preserved of the town's four-room houses, most having been replaced or extensively remodeled after the company sold the town in the 1950s.
