DESCRIPTION (Continued) The and one-half story brick structure with rear one and one-half story attached ell. Building has a pitched roof with gable-end facing the street. A moided cornice encloses the eaves and forms a complete return over the gable-end.

In the gable itself is an eliptical window with sandstone surround with keystone and sill. The other floors have evenly spaced fenestration, three (3) bays in front facade, with 6 x 6 sash. A sandstone flat-arch and sill marks each window.

Painting by Osbert Loomis, reproduction at Connecticut Savings Bank, Broad Street This house was built for Coi. James Loomis in 1822 and was one of many residences that once lined the Center Green. Erected during the early settlement of Windsor, the building used bricks manufactured by the Mack Brick Company, formerly operated on Mack Street in Windsor. James Loomis was a seventh generation descendant of Joseph Loomis who settled in Windsor in 1639. Colonel Loomis was the proprietor of the village store which was one of the very few commercial outlets on the Green at the time. It stood in the lot south of the main house. Middletown, CT Historic Preservation Planner Preston C. Michael K. Nor thwest exterior restoration has been sympathetic to the original fabric at the same time remained in residential use until the 1970 purchase and renovation for a bank. stands as an example of Late Federal period domestic architecture, Loomis married Abigall Sherwood Chaffee Loomis and had six (6) sons and one (1) daughter.
