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Summary

The Cafeteria Building -- Cleveland School is a single-story, rectangular-plan building constructed circa 1930 in the Craftsman style of architecture. A composition-shingled gable roof with exposed rafters and ornamental brackets at the gable ends shields the novelty-sided frame walls, which are supported by stone piers. The building contains a single interior brick chimney.

Elaboration

The eastern or front elevation features two raised entrances located near each corner. Due to the underlying terrain, the southern entrance is somewhat higher than the northern doorway and requires seven concrete steps. Both single-leaf doors are covered by small, below-the-roofline, hipped roofs supported by two brackets apiece. The eastern elevation is fenestrated by five windows between the doorways. A set of three, six-over-six, double-hung windows are positioned just south of the northern entrance, and two, side-by-side, six-pane awning windows are placed just north of the southern entrance.

The southern elevation is lighted by a central set of four, six-pane, awning windows. Louvered attic vents are placed in the pediment of both gable ends. The western elevation consists of two side-by-side, six-pane awning windows located near the southern corner and two sets of side-by-side, six-over-six, double-hung windows situated near the northern corner. The northern elevation is fenestrated by a set of two centrally placed, six-over-six, double-hung windows.

The building is currently unoccupied.

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Cafeteria Building -- Cleveland School

In the spring of 1930, a survey team from the State Board of Education in Little Rock visited Conway County to determine how the county could best pursue the recommendations of the state's 1927 consolidation studies. Later that year, the county board of education agreed to close down a number of one-room school districts and embark on a radical program of consolidation and reorganization in the county. On July 30, a new consolidated district, comprised of 14 smaller districts, was established in the northwest portion of Conway County to create the Cleveland Consolidated School District No. 68. Complying with the recommendations of the State Board's study qualified the new district for approximately \$50,000 in financial aid through the state's equalization fund for that year. On August 1, the Morrilton Democrat reported "[t]he progressive steps taken by the County Board of Education Wednesday places Conway county at the top of the ladder in school consolidation programs for counties in the Arkansas River Valley."

Initially, the Cleveland School District was authorized to operate a Class C high school during the 1930-31 school term, which would then be elevated to a Class B institution the following year. The district requested and received \$30,000 in funding from the State Revolving Loan Fund for the construction of a new brick high school building by the end of the year; temporary quarters in the nearby community of Lanty would house the district's high school until the new facilities were in place. An eight-month school term, "increasing the educational opportunities for the boys and girls of the rural sections," began in October; most of the 81 students who enrolled had never had access to a high school before. When state funding came available in 1931, a new high school was constructed in Wonderview.

The Cafeteria Building -- Cleveland School was originally built in 1930 as a cafeteria to serve the elementary school which remained in the community after consolidation; later, the cafeteria was converted to classroom use.¹

The Cafeteria Building -- Cleveland School, constructed during the period covered by the historic context *The Evolution of the Public School System in the Arkansas Ozarks*, 1920-1940, is a representative example of a small, wood frame school building constructed for a rural school district. Its use during this period as a local school building clearly identifies it with this historic context and with this property type. It is significant locally under Criterion A through its direct

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associations with the history of the evolution of the public school system in the Ozark Mountain region of the state during this period.
