and casemetant windows open inward. There is a partial basement and laundry room on the first floor. The bathroom floor is one step above the level of the hallway on the second floor. Storage space is in a walk-in attic on the second floor.

This house is architecturally significant because it is one of a group of stone masonry houses built by Arnold F. Meyer & Company, Inc. according to the construction methods of Ernest Flagg. It is also significant because it resembles the house illustrated on plate 20B in Flagg's book on small houses and the house at 1913 E. Olive Street.
