Describe the present and original (if known) physical appearance

The San Sebastián Mártir Church sits in front of the town plaza, oriented on an East-West axis, its entrance facing West. The church is surrounded by streets on three of its sides and by private structures on its east side. It is separated from its immediate surroundings by a concrete and iron grillwork fence enclosing a paved cement area which is used for parking purposes.

The church was designed by State Architect Don Pedro Cobreros and was built between 1895 and 1897. The plan follows the basilica prototype of two aisles and a nave. It is covered with a flat concrete roof. The original roof was probably made of wood beams and layers of brick. The apse is covered with a brick dome. The plan consists of six bays plus the apse/sacristies. Simple arcades resting on round columns divide the aisles from the main nave. The side aisles are lower than the central nave, allowing space for a clerestory consisting of four round openings on each side, that give light to the interior space. At the entrance there is a concrete choir loft over the vestibule.

The floors are covered with the original grey and white marble tiles. The doors and windows are modern, made of glass and metal, with arches of colored plexiglass.

The facade is typical of Cobreros' style and is very similar to that of San Mateo church in Santurce, which was also designed by this architect. The facade is subdivided in three sections, vertically as well as horizontally, by simple moldings of low relief. Two towers flank the central body which includes a large arched entrance framed with pilasters and a simple molding. Above the doorway, a round opening crowns the facade. The towers, divided into three levels (Westwork arrangement), have simple arched windows. The upper section of the tower is decorated with dentils and a cornice. The side facades have an arched doorway and two arched windows each. The dome has structural ribs which can be seen from the exterior.

The church conserves most of its original elements, except the roof and choir loft, and is in good structural condition. There are other elements of superficial nature like the doors, windows, fluorescent lights and fans which are not in accordance with the sober style of the church. Apart from these, the most noticeable alteration to the church has been the addition of a parish house to the north and rear sides of the building.

Statement of Significance (in one paragraph)

The San Sebastian Martir church is of historical and architectural significance. It is one of a group of five churches designed between 1890 and 1896 by State Architect Don Pedro Cobreros who created an austere, yet noble style, which played an important role in the history of religious architecture in Puerto Rico. Construction began in 1895 using the facade foundations, the side walls and the dome over the apse of an earlier original church and was completed in 1897. Despite the addition of a parish house to the rear and north sides and the reconstruction of the original roof and choir loft in concrete, the building retains most of is original construction and design elements. The traditional relationship of Town Plaza, city hall and church is maintained, in accordance with Spanish Crown ordinances at the time the town was founded, providing a living example of Spanish town planning practices.


