DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Two structures are included in this nomination. The first, original church, was begun in 1856 and completed in 1858. It is $36^7 \times 80^7$, with a gable roof, and five bays in length. The lancet windows with simple stone sills are partially filled in to accommodate modern windows. A lower, matching, single-bay addition was made sometime after 1897. It originally served as the choir, and has since been converted to an entrance. The structure is presently used as a meeting hall, and has over time been altered inside. Aside from a small modern frame addition to the rear (containing restrooms), the exterior retains its original character.

The second, later church was completed in 1899. It is in the Gothic style, its limestone laid in rusticated random ashlar pattern. The principal feature of the church is a tower, over twice the height of the building. The tower has mitred corners and four louvred lancet openings. The corners are further marked by mitre capped buttresses rising from below. The slender, 8-sided spire has peaked gables at the base, and above a course halfway up, are three triangular, louvred openings. The front corners of the church have capped buttresses. Lancet windows exhibit tracery, and decorative pilasters separate the bays. A stone chimney is at the rear of the gabled, slate-covered roof. The front facade is pierced by one round rose window and weveral pointed-arched tracery windows of varying sizes. Tracery is also evident in the light over the front door.

The vaulting in the interior is supported by two rows of columns ornamented with plaster capitals. The main nave is 36 feet high in the clear, the side naves $27\frac{1}{2}$ feet high. The sanctuary is 22 feet wide, 20 feet deep, and 32 feet high, with vaulting to correspond with that of the main nave. The stained glass and oak woodwork are original.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The juxtaposition of these two church buildings illustrate the changing fortunes of a small town parish. The first church is simple and basic because the pioneers did not have the means nor disposition for elaborate grandeur in their religious structures. In contrast, the congregation of the later 1800's had the wealth to commission a Victorian Gothic church reminiscent of northern European cathedrals, and their choice of design reflected the changing architectural enthusiasms of the age.
