## DESCRIPTION

- 7a. Architectural style: Neo-Classical
- 7b. Briefly describe the site or structure and describe any major alterations from its original condition:

This three story building is constructed of brick with classical pilasters extending the height of the upper floor windows. Above the windows is brick work patterns in the form of a stylized classical Originally this facade was terminated by a stepped entablature. parapet. Sometime between 1912-1920 the large over-hanging cornice supported on brackets was added. The original store front consists of a recessed central entrance flanked by large plate glass display windows. The second and third story windows are tri-partite fixed metal sash with metal panels marking the second floor level. windows on all three levels are surmounted by multi-pane transom lights.

The large open interior space is original, complete with iron columns, wooden staircase and pressed metal ceiling.
