DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Pine Street School, built in 1922, is a simple Mediterranean Revival stucco building with strong Romanesque and Renaissance Revival elements. The building's two-story horizontal facade, flanked by asymmetrical protruding wings, terminates in a low hipped tile roof. A simple panelled cornice frieze, repeated in the central facade, and narrow round-arched windows and doorways add Renaissance detailing to an otherwise plain exterior.

The building was abandoned as a school in 1967, and recently purchased and rehabilitated as a shopping complex. The building's structural and textural integrity remain intact, with the minor addition of an amphitheatre and three small shops which were constructed to enhance the scale of the existing building as well as help the circulation pattern. A red tile roof has been reinstalled, the building returned to its original white exterior color, and the interior classrooms converted to shops. The major change has occurred in the grounds which have been altered to provide commodious walkways and resting spaces for the public.

## STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Pine Street School, built in 1922, is Redding's third public grammar school and replaced two earlier school buildings, the first built in 1873 and the second in 1881. The building is representative of a school construction program which took place throughout California in the early 1920's in an attempt to improve the school system, and is significant as an example of the architectural style utilized in this massive undertaking.

Moreover, it is representative of the turn-of-the-century awakening in California to her own colonial past. The awakening which first focused on the long-neglected California Franciscan missions also found its expression in the Mediterranean Revival mode of which this building is an example.

The building retains its original integrity, and as a school in continuous operation from 1922 to 1967 provides Redding with a sense of time and place.
