Intermediate boundary marker Southeast #3 is situated in the front yard of 3908 Southern Avenue. It is located approximately 45 feet southeast of the centerline of Southern Avenue and 175 feet northeast of centerline of Suitland Terrace, S.E. The sandstone marker is in poor condition. A 3' x 3' x 5' iron fence, in fair condition, surrounds the marker.

Verbal Boundary Description:

The stone is located at 3908 Southern Avenue approximately 45 feet southeast of the centerline of Southern Avenue and 175 feet northeast of the centerline of Suitland Terrace, S.E. The fence surrounds the stone.

Boundary Justification:

The boundary stone and fence have historically been situated at this location and maintain historic integrity.
